A PROGRESSIVE SUNDAY SCHOOL

A Paper on the Rise and Progress of the School in Kensington.

The article reproduced below is a paper prepared and read by Miss M. E. Bentley at an anniversary service of Kensington Sabbath School. It is now published at the request of a number of readers:—

In the spring of 1875, in a small dilapidated school-house on the corner of Merrill and Victoria Streets, in Barrett's Cross, now called Kensington, a meeting was held for the purpose of organizing a Sabbath School.

At this meeting, all the Protestant denominations, consisting chiefly of Episcopalians, Presbyterians and Methodists, were represented, each being desirous of having a school. Neither congregation having ability to support one alone, it was decided to unite and a Union School was accordingly organized.

Among those present at this meeting were the late Thomas and Mrs. Sims, the late John and Mrs. Glover, Miss Grace Webster, John Sharpe, G. W. Bentley, and others. As all felt the importance of having the work started at once, it was moved by Mrs. Sims that Mr. Bentley be Superintendent, which was unanimously carried.

During the summer months, school continued to be held in this same little building, until 1877, when the Public Hall being completed, it afforded a more spacious meeting-place for the growing needs. Some of the first teachers who came forward to help, were the late Mrs. John Glover, Mrs. T. Walker, Miss Grace Webster, Mrs. Matthew Sheenan, and later on

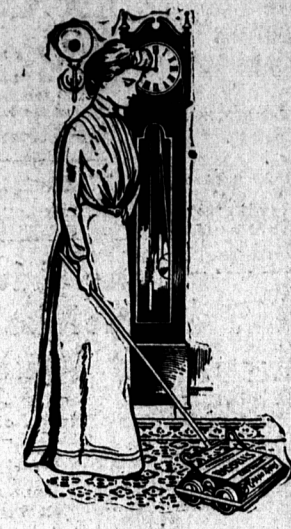
\$175,000 OIL FIRE.

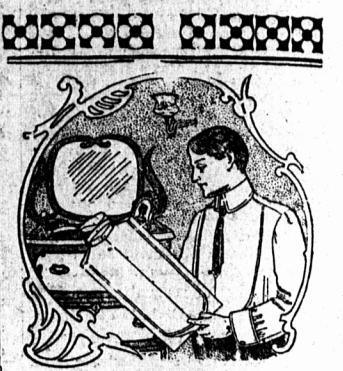
