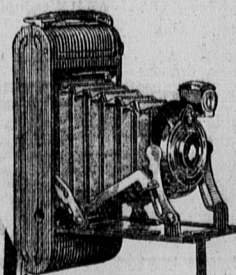

OTTAWA, Ont., Sept. 19.—Canada's 1931 wheat crop will total 382,514,000 bushels, according to an official forecast by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, based on reports from crop correspondents throughout the Dominion. The average yield an acre of wheat will be 16 1/2 bushels, compared with 15 1/2 bushels, the average for last ten years.

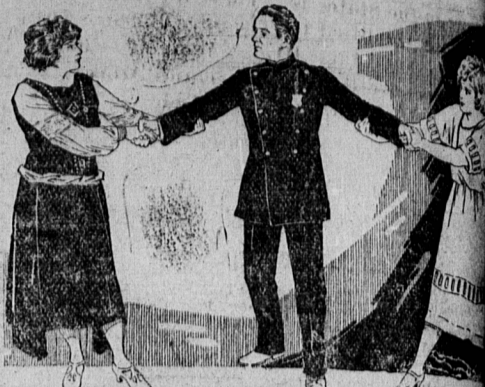
