THE OAT SITUATION.—In summing up the oat situation throughout the world Mr. T. W. Donnan, Com-missioner Imperial Agricultural Institute, Ottawa, says: "Western Europe must seek in the Americas her supply of oats. It is doubtful whether Canada can spare much of its 1914 crop. The United States and Argentina are the only other sources. The United States crop is no larger than is needed for domestic consumption; the Argentine crop will not be available until late winter or early spring. For the next few months there will naturally be considerable pressure on United States and Canada to supply the demand. The price of oats in Prince Edward Island is undoubtedly going higher and farmers need not feel that it will fall this spring at least. Mr. Richard Creed will bring out the whole situation with regard to the shortage of food and feed supplies at the Agricultural Conference which he is now holding. On Wednesday next he will be at Kelvin; on Thursday at Coleman; on Friday at Glenwood. Everyone interested is invited to attend these meetings.

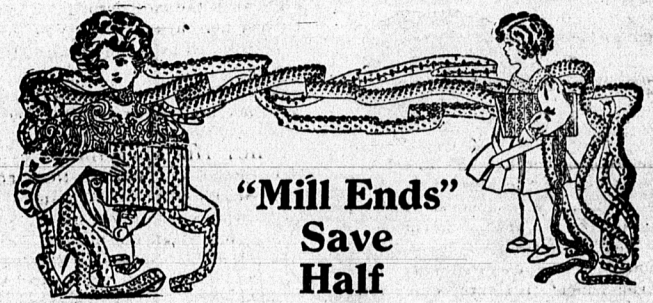
