SAILORS' NERVES AFFECTED Some interesting stories of the way in which life at sea during wartime affected the nervous system of a number of our sailors are told by Surgeon-Lieutenant Alan F. Grimby. Dr. Grimby has witnessed in two or three of his patients "a very remarkable state, which I can best describe as the 'fear of going ashore'." This may seem paradoxical; he adds, "When under war conditions, men are situated for a prolonged period far away from civilization, confined to a ship for months at a time without seeing a human face apart from the too familiar ones on board, as it be wondered that nervous systems may be affected? "I have known of one ship on a foreign station on which seven occupants of the wardroom never spoke to one another for six months except for purposes of convenience or rebuke." TIT-BIT.
