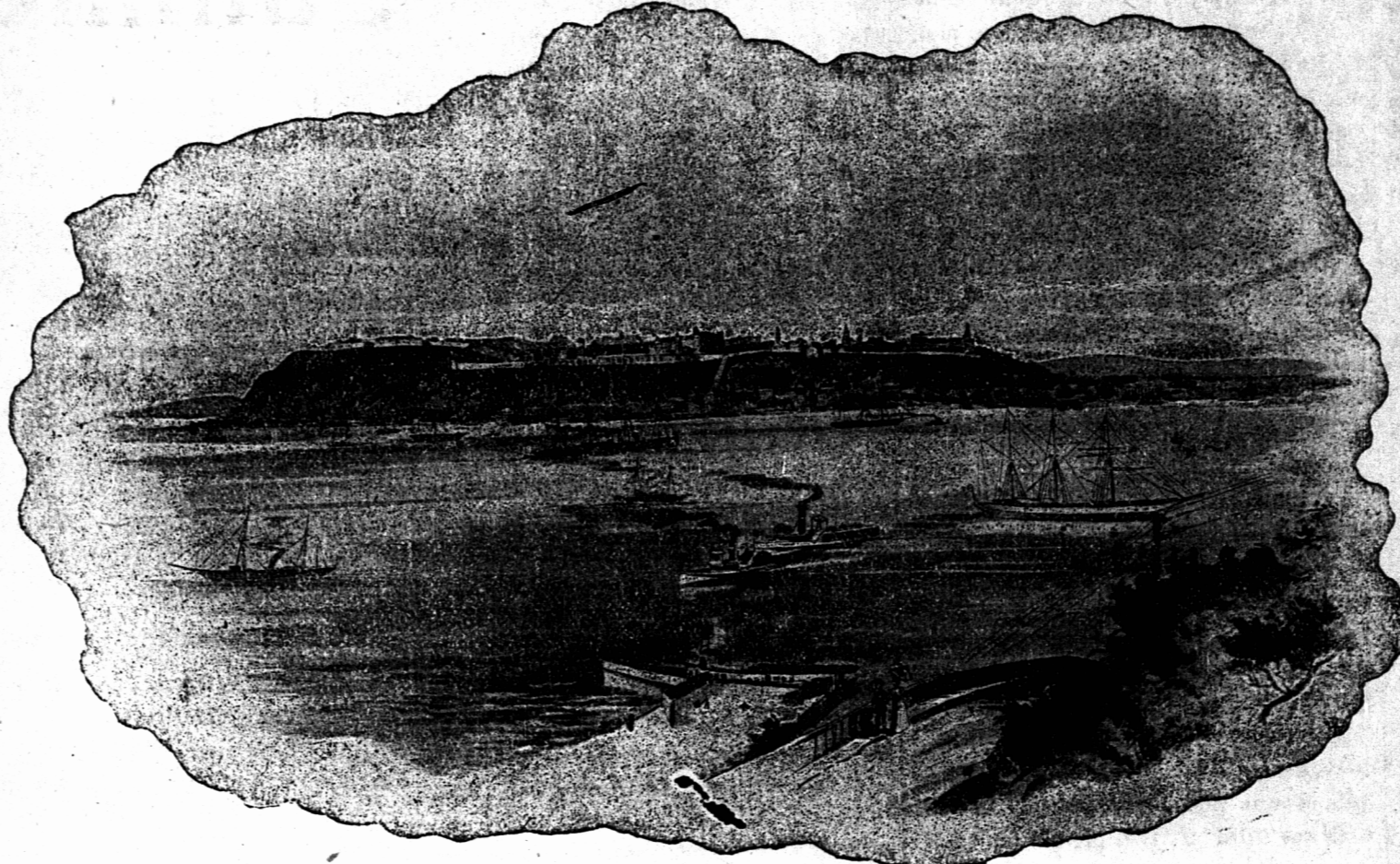

THE BOER INVASION

Of Cape Colony Successfully Checked

THE ENEMY'S LOSSES

Boer General Killed—Movements Hampered by Loss of Horses

INVASION OF CAPE COLONY CHECKED.

CAPE TOWN, May 28.—(Special).—The dash of Kritzinger's invaders into Cape Colony has been checked at Vandaesburg by a swift movement of Gerringer's and other columns and the Boers swerved toward Cloetha.

BOERS BEING WEAKENED.

The continued capture of horses by the British has greatly hampered the Boer mobility and reduced their strength.

KILLED BY EXPLODING SHELL.

PRETORIA, May 28.—(Special).—The Boer General Schoeman and his daughter have been killed and his wife and two others were badly injured by the explosion of a lyddite shell which they were keeping as a curiosity.

THE BOERS' CASUALTIES.

Advices from Lord Kitchener say that since May 20th the British columns report 63 Boers killed, 36 wounded, 23 prisoners and 83 surrendered.
