WIND STORM.—The high wind that prevailed on Thursday practically all day, attained its greatest velocity between ten and eleven o'clock in the evening when for an hour it blew at an average rate of twenty seven miles. Between eleven o'clock and noon it was blowing an average of twenty five miles. As this was the average rate for an hour at a time, it can easily be seen that for short periods it was blowing much harder, and at times approached the velocity of a gale or forty miles an hour. The wind, which was from the southwest, veering to the south east, was accompanied by an exceptionally high tide.

English Statesman A Good Sleeper

PARIS, Oct. 21. — A new problem in diplomacy faced the French when Stanley Baldwin, the British Prime Minister, recently arrived in Paris found asleep.

The train that brought Mr. Baldwin from his holiday retreat at Aix-les-Bains reached Paris a little later than ten o'clock in the morning. Arrayed in silk hats, representatives of the French government were waiting at the station platform to extend the usual formal greeting accorded visiting heads of foreign governments. They approached the door of the sleeping car in which Mr. Baldwin had his compartment. A Scotland Yard detective told them Mr. Baldwin was still abed. In a little while the car would be switched onto another train destined for Calais.

What was to be done? Mr. Baldwin solved the problem by waking up, dressing hurriedly and receiving the deputies just before the car was pulled out of the station.

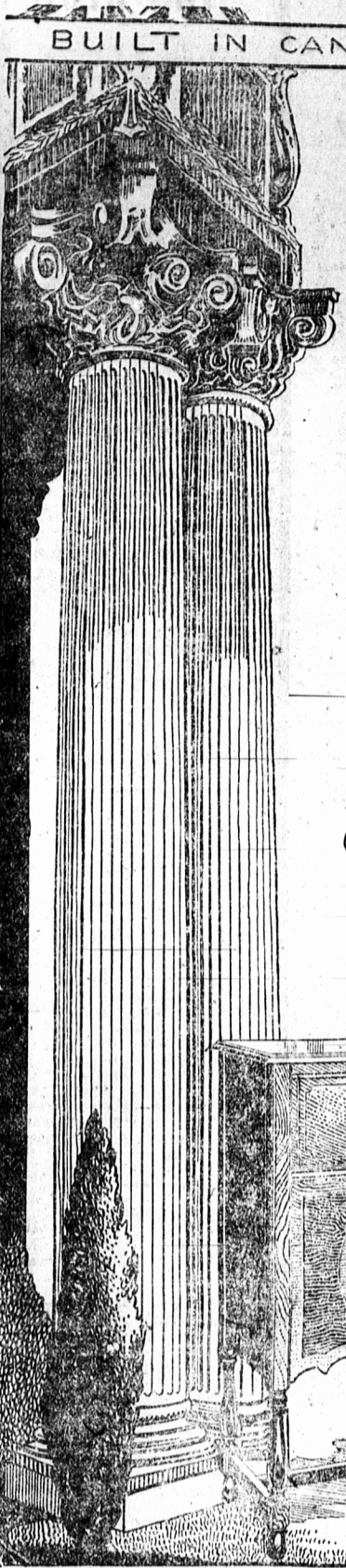
