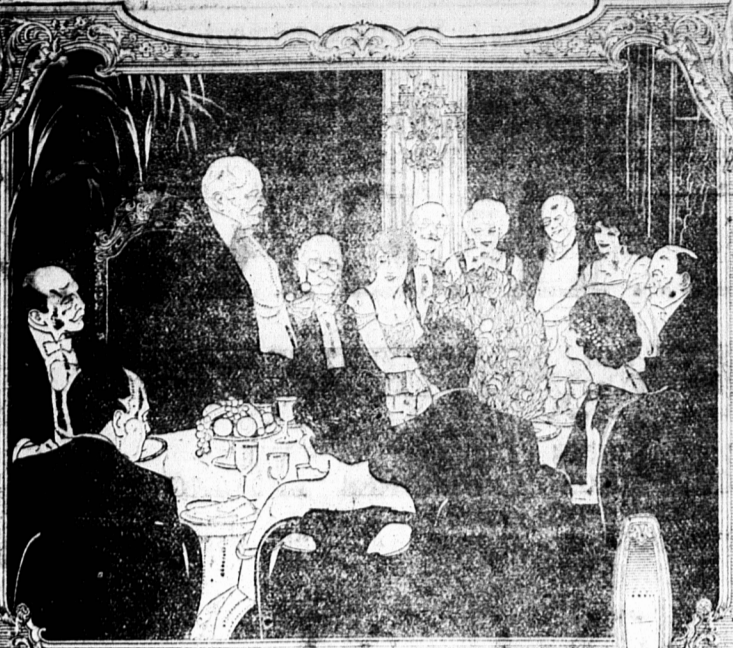

WELL KNOWN VISITOR—Miss A. Gertrude Coulson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John B. Coulson of 157 Dewey Street, Worcester, Mass. formerly of Prince Edward Island, received Friday the Bachelor of Education degree at commencement exercises of Boston University in Tremont Temple, Boston. Miss Coulson, who is a teacher in the Gates Lane School, has a remarkably brilliant record as a student. She completed her three years' course in the Normal School

in 1912 at the head of her class and name was first on the recommendation list prepared for school superintendents. In the city examinations for teachers' certificates she attained a mark of 93 per cent, the highest in a class nearly 100 applicants. She is the first Worcester girl to receive a degree from the School of Education of the Boston University which requires from one and a half to two years' study in addition to the normal course. special part scholarship awarded in recognition for her previous work, was among the honors conferred on Miss Coulson. One of the many tributes that have been paid to her was that of Dr. Wilde, director of the school of education. When addressing the Normal School faculty and students a few weeks ago, Dr. Wilde said he was proud of Miss Coulson in his school as a graduate of the Normal School—Worcester Gazette.
