The annual banquet of the young members of the League of the Cross was held in the society's Hall on Wednesday evening. After the "inner man" had been atandantly supplied a musical program, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all, was put on. The affair terminated about 10 p. m. and the boys went home after what they termed "a dandy time."

SERIOUS ACCIDENT.

Her friends regret to learn that Mrs. John J. McEachern, West St. Peters, who fell on the ice two weeks ago, fracturing her hip seriously, is still suffering considerably. Mrs. McEachern at the time of the accident, had a narrow escape from perishing, as it was a very cold day, and there was no help near at the time, her son being working in the woods some distance away. One of the neighbors, Mr. Angus McPherson, hearing the cries for help, went over to see what was wrong, and found the poor woman unable to move and greatly chilled. It was with considerable difficulty that she was removed to the house (she being a stout woman) and made comparatively comfortable, till the doctor arrived.—L.

INTERESTING DEBATE.

The students of the Long Course in Agriculture held a debate last evening, the subject being "Resolved that horse raising is as profitable in this Province as cattle raising." The debate was opened by Howard Dobie, who pointed out that the cow was profitable only for milk and beef; whereas the horse was the power machine on the farm and was essential for the proper tillage of the soil. He was also a great contributor to the pleasure of farm life and valuable on account of the work he did. Archibald Collins made a very clear case in favor of cattle raising. He spoke of the importance of the dairy industry in this Province; there was so much money in cattle raising that he was sure the vote would go in favor of it. He made a point of the manure on the farm as a great fertilizer. Cyrus Polier took exception to some of the statements made by Mr. Collins. He said that the census showed the average cow in Prince Edward Island to be giving about 2,500 pounds of milk and that this cow could not be fed for \$35. He argued that the foal was more easily raised than the calf and brought in a great deal more money. The mare could do the work just the same while she was rearing the foal and he felt sure that cattle raising was not as profitable as horse raising. Benjamin Gallant pointed out that cattle were useful as producers of milk and that when they were too old they could be fattened and their carcasses sold as beef. He questioned the great profits there were in raising foals and said that the horses required abundant food and attention. He felt that he had made a clear case in favor of cattle. Mr. W. J. Cass went into the case of raising horses and cattle and tried to persuade his hearers that there was no profit in cattle raising but a great deal of profit in horse raising. Leo McDonald could not agree with Mr. Cass's figures. He said that his friend had compared the raising of pure bred horses with the raising of scrub cattle, but had failed to take into consideration the training of the horses which was absolutely necessary before they could be put on the market. Cattle did not require this training. He did not doubt that some money could be made on horse raising, but every one could make money in cattle, and that without any appreciable risk. Messrs Collins and Dobie then summed up the arguments for the respective sides, and on the vote being taken it was found that the majority of the audience considered horse raising as profitable as cattle raising in this Province. The subject of debate for Friday evening is, "Resolved that Prince Edward Island is a better place for a young man to start in life than Western Canada."

FARMERS' BANQUET.

The Strattona Farmers' Institute held its annual banquet in the Florida Hotel at Pownal on Monday evening. It was attended by about one hundred and fifty persons consisting of farmers, their sons, wives and daughters. There was first a business meeting at which the work of the Institute for the year was reviewed and plans were discussed for future work. Many new members were secured. After that the good things provided for the "inner man" were taken. The following programme was rendered: Address by the newly-appointed President, Mr. Ledwell Jenkins; toasts to the King; toast to "Agriculture," responded to by Professor Ross; solo by Miss Enid Smith; toast to "Our Country," responded to by Robert Jenkins; duet, "Sweet Genevieve," by Mr. and Miss Ross, of Vernon; address, "The social side of Farmers' Institutes," by Rev. Mr. McVie; solo "Moonlight Bay," by Mrs. Lincoln Jenkins; address, "Education," by Rev. Mr. Weeks; toast "The Ladies," by Mr. J. A. Moore; and toast "Our Host and Hostess."

ENJOYABLE TIME.

Notwithstanding the coldness of the night, a most enjoyable Bean Social was held on Tuesday night, the 10th, in the French River Hall, under the auspices of the Women's Institute. The principal feature of the evening was a most instructive and interesting lecture by the Rev. Mr. Watson, pastor of St. Mary's church, Kensington. His subject was, "A trip to China," and for about an hour the learned lecturer held the rapt attention of his audience.
