To prevent motor vehicles skidding an inventor has developed an attachment with which drivers can release sand in front of their wheels.

Of secret composition, a chemical ice invented in Germany for skating rinks does not melt until a temperature of 200 degrees is exceeded.

This production from coal and other hydrocarbons of an oil that will kill any known germ is the claim of a Salt Lake City mining engineer.

At the present rate of production the potash deposits of Alsace are estimated to contain enough salts to last from seven to eight centuries.

For preserving insects for museums a German scientist has discovered a method for coating them with wax without impairing their markings.

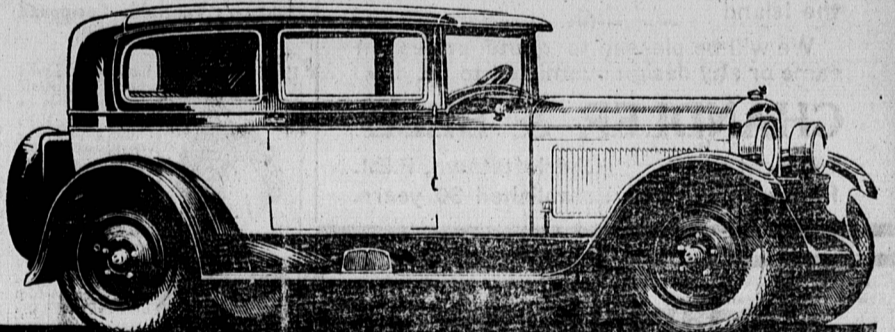
