Today the provincial by-elections take place in the Cardigan and West River districts. There is a good deal of interest in the result. Look out for the returns in The Guardian tomorrow morning.

The Dominion plebiscite of 1902 gave city in Ontario except Brantford gave majorities against prohibition. Now eight cities out of fifteen including Toronto, which is much the largest of them all, have given majorities in favor of prohibition.

The lately deceased G. A. Henty, well known as a writer of boys' stories, produced so many volumes, almost all in the eighties and nineties, that six closely printed pages of the London Museum catalogue are filled with the titles. Few if any writers were as once so prolific, so entertaining and so free from reasonable objection, as Henty. His stories will have wide reading long after his demise.

Three of Boston's thirteen Aldermen have charged the city with back bills in excess of \$1,000 each during the past seven months. One Alderman Bowen's bill is \$1,300, or at the rate of \$2,341 for the year. This is over \$6 a day, supposed to be spent in the public service for back fares, while the city is netted with street cars. Our City Councilors are decidedly modest in their local travelling expenses when judged by the Boston standard. Should the remaining five months of the year be run at the same rate Boston will be asked to pay aldermanic back fares amounting to \$15,720, and this although several of the Aldermen make no charge for their conveyance about the city.

It was given out at a political meeting in Cardigan that Messrs Davis & Fraser had not sufficient financial standing to justify the Provincial Government in having dealings with them in the matter of establishing a pork-packing, canning and cold storage industry here. The statement was also made that R. T. Holman had been buying for the Halifax firm and once in warm weather he had a warehouse full which they refused to take off his hands, and which Mr. Holman sold to the Dominion Packing Company, which came to his relief. It is due to Messrs Davis & Fraser to say that they claim to be able to command any capital required for the business and that this has been established by a letter from their bankers to the Government here. They reply to the other story by wire, tersely as follows: "Holman story false. No dealings with him."

The Quebec Board of Trade at a very large and representative meeting on the 4th instant strongly endorsed the Trans-continental Railway project to build from Quebec to Port Simpson, E. C. and strongly condemned the Grand Trunk Pacific railway scheme. In a series of resolutions adopted it was set forth that a trans-continental railway ought to give the shortest route between the two oceans, with its Atlantic port on the St. Lawrence in summer and at Halifax or St. John in winter, that it ought to supply the needs of a country not now supplied with railways; that it ought to be a distinctly Canadian road; that the Grand Trunk with its present termini at Chicago and Portland respectively begins and ends in a foreign country, and it extended would carry Canadian products to a foreign port for shipment. All this and much more was set forth, from all of which we are led to conclude that the Grand Trunk may have a pretty big fight on their hands before they secure the subsidy and land grant for which application is being made.
