**Rumors Lift Gold Stocks To New High**

TORONTO, Nov. 17 (CP)—Strong rumors persisted on the street that Finance Minister Abbott tonight will broadcast the government's plans to aid the gold mining industry and traders today lifted gold stocks on the Toronto stock exchange to a new index high for the year. Seniors and better grade junior golds started pushing upward from opening with trade heavy in selected issues. Dome added 3-4 at 12-1/2 to 4.775 shares, Hollinger 1-4 at 12-1/8 to 4.072 shares, Kerr 1-4 at 15 3-4, Lake Shore 1-4 at 16-1/4, McIntyre 1-4 at 17-1/2, Sagma 60 at \$9.50, Aunor 15 at \$1.60, Teek Hughes 10 at \$4.10 and 21 shares at \$3.25.

Several of the rising juniors failed to close on their high for the day but substantial increases were posted by Canadian Malartic, Chesterville, Cochenour, East Malartic, Kirkland Lake, Lake Wasa, Alaska, Malartic, O'Brien, San Antonio, Pioneer, Presfont, Sladen, Tourn, Upper Canada, Central Patricia and Convest dropped 20 and 25 cents respectively.

Trading box score: Stocks traded 196, higher 78, lower 65, unchanged 58, new highs 10 and new lows 7.

IN THE MATTER OF LANDING FEES AND EXTRA CHARGES FOR AVIATION FUEL AT AIRPORTS IN CANADA.

Representations have been made that landing fees in accordance with Information Circular No. 8/55/47 issued by Department of Transport Air Services Branch, Civil Aviation Division, and extra charges for aviation fuel, presently imposed at airports in Canada are too onerous on air carriers.

The Air Transport Board has been requested to review the situation and, to this end, will hear representations at a public hearing, on December 9th, 1947, at 10:00 a.m. at Ottawa, Canada, in the Board Room, Air Transport Board, No. 3 Temporary Building.

Any person desiring to make representations concerning the matter must file a submission with the Secretary, Air Transport Board, No. 3 Temporary Building, Ottawa, Ontario, before December 1st, 1947.

At the hearing the Board will hear representations from and on behalf of such persons as may have filed submissions in pursuance of this notice and from such other persons as may be authorized by the Board to intervene.

When a person entitled to be heard intends to file written memoranda or data by way of exhibits, he should, in all cases, to facilitate the expeditious conduct of the proceedings, prepare seven copies for the use of the Board.

**Papers And Golds Set New Marks On Montreal Exchange**

MONTREAL, Nov. 17 (CP)—Papers, exhibiting strength on expanded volume, reached a new index high for the year today while other industrial groups were comparatively dull on the stock exchange and curb market here today. A few selected mines recorded substantial gains to push the gold's index up to a new high for the year also.

Closing index averages indicated banks up .08 to 28.13; utilities off 1-4 to 76.9; industrials up 2 to 128; papers up 1.86 to a new high of 383.56; and golds up 1.92 to a new high of 70.

**Price Changes Narrow On N. Y. Exchange**

NEW YORK, Nov. 17 (AP)—The stock market responded to the President's message today with mild irregularity and relatively slow dealings.

While assorted favorites showed fairly good headway at the close, minus signs predominated.

Canadian issues were irregular. Canadian Pacific and McIntyre each gained 1-4. Dome Mines was down 1-2 and Hiram Walker dropped 3-4. Distillers Sagrams was inactive.

On the curb, Lake Shore added 1-2 while Giant Yellow Knits gained 1-8.

Allegheny Corp. Prior Preferred added 1-4 at 42 on talk of refinancing the former issue. A pleasing year-end disbursement lifted Du Pont 1 at 188, while Motors was up 1-1/8 at 23 3-4 as the company, due to market conditions, called off a planned offering of additional stock to shareholders. Nickel Plate Railway advanced 1-1/8 at 37. Boeing 1-1/8 at 18 1-2, Douglas Aircraft 1-1/4 at 19 1-2, Allied Chemical 1 at 19 1-2, and Dow Chemical 1-1/8 at 39 3-8.

New 1947 lows were touched by Consolidated acid Edison which finished off 1-2 at 21 1-4, Ever-sharp 7-8 at 10 7-8, and Bohm Aluminum 1 at 29 1-2. On the off-side were Youngstown, Sheet General Motors, Goodrich, Woolworth, International Harvester, Sperry, American Telephone General Electric, Kennecott, Philip Morris, Great Northern Railway and Northern Pacific.
