**STEEL SHIP-BUILDING.**

The establishment of the great steel works at Sydney has opened the prospect for restoring the ship-building industry in new form to the Maritime Provinces. Forty or fifty years ago the construction of wooden ships was a great and prosperous industry in the Provinces which now constitute Eastern Canada. That industry, in which fortunes were made by the builders and large and remunerative employment was given to labor, has for years past been practically dead, and its decline has been a very serious drawback to the prosperity of the eastern section of the Dominion.

Nothing could be more desirable from an industrial and national point of view, than that the construction of steel ships should take the place of the lapsed and decayed wooden ship building of the olden time. The time has come when it seems practicable. Steel can now be produced in the United States something more cheaply than in the United Kingdom. As we showed the other day, there is a good prospect that steel will this year be produced at Sydney more cheaply than at Pittsburg. If this expectation is realized the way will be clear for the creation of a ship-building industry in the eastern Provinces which may far eclipse in magnitude the ship-building operations of the olden times.

Both Halifax and St. John are on the alert to take advantage of the new opening. In the former city \$200,000 has been subscribed, and in the latter, where the movement is yet under way one half that sum has been subscribed towards establishing companies to carry on the building of steel ships. Halifax city proposes to give a bonus of \$200,000 towards starting the new industry. St. John has yet to be heard from in that way, but will hardly be out-done by her rival. So the prospect opens at present very pleasingly. One St. John shipping firm alone has in recent years had 12 steel ships built, on the other side of the Atlantic, and there is a strong and natural desire that if possible the required tonnage shall be built in future at home ports.

At a recent meeting in St. John to consider this matter Mayor Daniel said it was proposed to establish works on such a scale that four large ships could be in course of construction at one time. Such works could give employment to 1,000 men and the construction of each vessel would involve very large annual outlay for labor. To give remunerative employment to so large a number of workmen, mainly skilled mechanics, must be an excellent thing for any locality in which the works will be established.

It is with great regret that we note the visit of His Royal Highness the Duke of Cornwall to Canada in September and October next no provision is apparently made for including Prince Edward Island in the royal progress. Our loyal people would greatly desire to see our future King, King Edward when he was Prince of Wales visited Charlottetown forty years ago. We trust that Sir Louis Davies and Premier Farquharson, who are for the time the persons to whom we must look to move in the matter, will spare no effort to secure such modification of the arrangements as will bring the Duke and Duchess to visit Prince Edward Island, if it can possibly be done.
