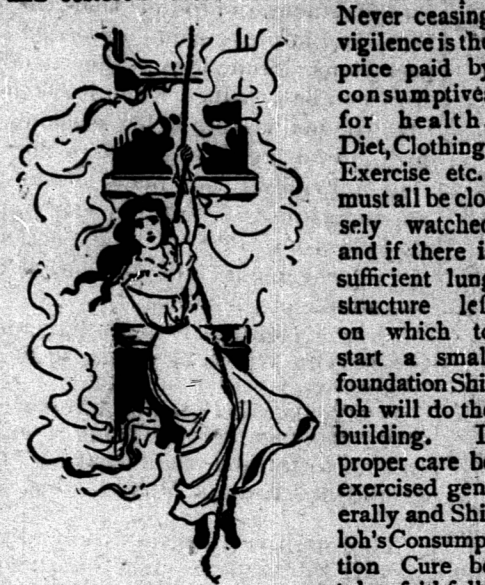

tyrannical neighbor should forever be made unable to treat an American as an inferior person? I have been twice to South Africa and have spent twelve years in England and her colonies. She has only one set of laws for all people, I was in England when Dewey's victory was won and it was a pleasing fact that his victory was greeted with as much enthusiasm as if it had been an English one. I have known the Queen's birthday celebration to be postponed in Australia in order that the Colonials might join the Americans in one day of rejoicing on the fourth of July. At the Fourth of July dinners of the American Society in London (of which I am a member) we have each been joined by government official representatives, all grades of nobility, and representatives of the arts, science and commerce.

England is no more actuated in the present war by a greed for gold than she was a few years ago when she landed her blue jackets to extort an apology and money indemnity from Nicaragua for indignities to her vice consul in the Mosquito Territory. I see it is stated that the Democratic party propose to make the South African war a basis of an issue in the coming campaign. I cannot comprehend that a neighbor's troubles could be so basely used. It is observed that some of our anarchistic "statesmen" are talking pugnaciously about the British censor's treatment of our late consul's mail—a consul who deserted his post in the time of need. It is but fair that we should wait for official information.

Suppose the British consul at Havana during our war with Spain entrusted with American interests had cabled his government to the disparagement of the American cause and his cable had to pass through American territory and over cables owned by our citizens and these cable messages had fallen into the hands of General Shafter. Would Shafter have been right in withholding them? Would not the British consul have been guilty of a breach of trust confided to him by us and would he not have betrayed the duty his government had ordered him perform?
