SERMON BY REV. WM. M. FIELD

To the Members of Prince Arthur Lodge in Crapaud Methodist Church.

The members of Prince Arthur Lodge attended divine service in Crapaud Methodist church July 29, at 2.30 p. m. Representatives from other lodges were present. Rev. W. M. Field preached from Gen., 42:11 "we are true men." The preacher said his discourse would be part historical, part evangelical. Before entering upon his discourse, let me announce that we have as our guests the distinguished representatives of the L. O. A. Association, who in their organized capacity have assembled with us to worship Almighty God. Let me extend to our friends and fellow citizens of Orange order a very cordial welcome. In electing to come here at this hour and be addressed by one who is not entitled to be clothed with the regalia of your order, you have laid strong emphasis upon the truly Christian Catholic spirit of your splendid constitution. Let me remind you of its words that the L. O. A. is formed by persons desirous of supporting to the utmost of their power, principles and practices of the laws and constitution of the country, Christian religion to maintain the aid of the Association and other wise promote such laudable and benevolent purposes as may tend to the due ordering of religion and Christian charity, and the supremacy of the law, order and constitutional freedom.

Some people think the Association is only in existence for the purpose of fighting Roman Catholics, but this is not the case. It is in existence for the defence of liberty, civil and religious liberty. It lays its foundation in the field of British liberty; it disdains the badge of faction, knows no emblem save the altar and the throne. Standing in this Methodist pulpit today, I recall no more suitable words from which to speak than those of our text: "We are true men." We all know the Bible narrative. In consequence of the famine which prevailed, Joseph's brethren came down to Egypt to buy corn. In order to test their feelings toward their father, Benjamin and Joseph charged them with being spies. Their answer was: "We are upright, honest, peaceable, men of integrity, good intentions, friends, not foes." The Orange Association needs no apology. The church stands first divinely appointed of Christ. No society can claim more worthy adherents to be more loyal to country and monarch than the association represented today. Yet the order has been placed under a ban and like all secret societies it has been misunderstood, misrepresented. Probably many are asking today, who are you? What is the meaning of your signs and secrets? What the meaning of your rites and ceremonies? Is there anything in it? Are ye a sham? Are ye false spies? To such we answer. The order with all pertaining to it is real, true, living. Text: "We are friends not foes. What is an Orangeman? In reply I answer, a man. Not a mean little soulless person who lives for himself alone, but a man. The dimensions of a lodge, our sphere of action are immeasurable because its light is immeasurable. He who cannot be called a man cannot be called an Orangeman. You may belong to your society, but unless you have the spirit of an Orangeman, you are not an Orangeman. The preparation of the heart and anti-room must go together. Human nature is frail all human societies are fallible. The followers of creeds object to societies because they require secrecy. What are these secrets. They are signs, words or tokens by which one can recognize another, there cannot be any sin in such simple and innocent proceedings. All religious denominations have their own private meetings. Armies have their counter signs and words of recognition. The business man corresponds in cipher. The telegraphist is required by statute law to keep inviolate the secrets of the despatches he transmits. Thus as to regalia, attend service in Westminster Abbey or St. Paul's and you will see as much ceremony as in any order. In the cathedrals and churches of Canada you will see pomp and display, visit the Jewish synagogue and witness their ceremonies, attend Lutheran church, see clergymen in robes or gown. Go to the House of Parliament, see the royal robes, Lords in full gown. In England the barristers always wear their wig and gown. Our officers wear a regalia that indicates their authority and the members wear one that show their rank and the effect is good.

The mighty and historic church of Rome founded her great political, philosophical and religious structure upon a stone. The Orange Order is reared a works wide structure upon a stone, the copper stone of Liberty. Wm. I. placed his foot on landing at Torbay on Nov. 5, 1688, on a stone. As a fact of historical interest, the actual stone is still preserved in the centre of the quay at Torbay and is of much interest to those who visit that part of England. Emblematically this stone is the corner stone of every well regulated Orange Lodge. On the banks of the Boyne 1690 Protestants and Roman Catholics battled for supremacy and from out of the day's conflict came final settlement. You ask what led to this. In

the year 110 the sign of the cross was introduced and 215 years later Emperor Constantine made Christianity the religion of Rome. The Emperor's action was almost a disaster to the religion of Jesus Christ. The purity and simplicity of the Christian faith already obscured was now supported by sacerdotalism. Priestly ideas began to predominate. At the end of the 4th century images were introduced into the doctrine to which is directly attributed the acquisition was a terrible engine of torture, persecution and blood. People holding different views from that of the dominant church was forced by the most horrible of devices to relinquish their most cherished tenets. But through all the years of pain there existed a minority party. Some chose death to a change of faith; others of the martyrdom of those adherents grew Protestantism. Eventually a new religion appeared. The Bible was printed and circulated. The labors of Wycliffe and Luther bore fruit. England awoke to reformation. But on the accession of Henry 8, the land was again plunged in a struggle for religion liberty. The prisons of London and Smithfields fires showed the unbending character of those who refused to accept the faith of Rome. Through the reign of Catholic Mary and Elizabeth the contest for supremacy went on, but in the reign of the latter queen it was decreed that no foreign bishop or prince should have authority in England. This was a blow at the papacy and a struggle continued. But the time at last came when God spoke. Wm. Prince of Orange was chosen as the instrument whereby religious peace might be brought for all time to the troubled people of Britain. Since that battle no person within the confines of the United Kingdom has been put to death for religious difference of opinion.

The next century was one of readjustment and in 1795 there was formed in the north of Ireland the Orange order to counteract the influence of a party known as the ribbon men whose object was to strengthen in Ireland the position of the Roman church. The underlying principles were loyalty to God and country and support of christianity and civil laws. One essential to membership was belief in God. Dear brethren God has given unto you a banner. First he entrusted it to the immortal Prince Wm. III. Then he gave a banner to them that fear thee, that it may be displayed because of truth. As subjects of Great Britain we glory in our flag. It symbolizes the mightiest union the world has ever seen; a union com-

The message is to every son of English, Scotch or Irish parentage; stand together, love your country, love your kingdom, love God. I need not dwell at length upon the character and significance of the flag of that immortal Prince Wm. III to whom the entire western world both Catholic and Protestant owes so much. His life and work are well known to you all. His message bore the historic motto "Constitutional Government and liberty of conscience." That was the banner God gave him, and he was worthy of such an emblem and today after just celebrating another anniversary of the Battle of Boyne the voice of the people comes to you and as it came to King David in the valley of salt and to King William in the valley of the Boyne, unfurl your banner, be true men. Your duty is to display your banner, it is to unite and cement man to man, it is to take up the cross and follow Jesus. Religion is the fountain and bulwark of the nation's greatness and the perpetual guarantee of the people's safety. With the Orange association in Canada and all the colonies and in the Motherland and in the United States of America, each and all, pledged to maintain civil and religious liberty with equal rights to all and special privileges to none, with the ambition for a national school system as broad as the Empire, we may well hope for a speedy consummation of the time. "When the common sense of most shall hold a fretful realm in awe And the kindly earth shall slumber Lapped in universal law."

THE GUARDIAN'S BICYCLE ROAD RACE

The date of The Guardian's bicycle road race has been definitely fixed for Monday August twenty-four. If this date should prove unfavorable the race will take place on the following evening.

Entries are to be confined to Prince Edward Island riders alone. The race is for The Guardian's three-year-trophy, but in addition there will be a number of other prizes which will be announced in a few days. The course begins at the Charlottetown office in Charlotte Street and follows Grafton Street to Great George Street, thence continuing on to the Upper Malpeque Road which it follows to this side Milton station, thence taking the road to the left which runs alongside Moore's Mill stream and on to Warren's Corner, North River. From this corner the course will be across the North River Bridge to the Royal Arms, thence by Lower Malpeque Road to Brighton Road following Brighton Road out to the shore, then taking the Park Roadway, following the same round the Park and so to starting place—16 miles.
