NEW PERTH.—Now that the holiday season is past and the school fairs with their extra work over, New Perth School has settled down again to the work of the year, and under very satisfactory conditions. New Perth has always aimed to have a teacher of the highest class, and to make as few changes as possible, the resignation of the last teacher, Mr. E. Parker, after a term of three years, only being accepted on his assurance of going back to college. And now they are fortunate as ever in securing the services of Miss Jean McEwen, an experienced teacher who holds an honor diploma and is a resident of the settlement. During vacation the interior of the school room underwent some repairs, the walls finished with beaver board, the ceiling newly painted and the floor covered with sanitary linoleum, the seats and light so arranged as to give no cross light, and is very comfortable and convenient for both teacher and scholars. There are enrolled twenty two pupils of school age, with an average daily attendance of seventeen, and though the advanced class is not as large as last year owing to four of its number entering Prince of Wales College, there is no lack of material and in a few months will be up to its usual standard. New Perth School is one of those in the Province that has during the last fifty years sent the largest number of students to the P. W. C. and from the outlook at present there is every reason to believe that the number for years to come will be as great if not greater than it has been in the past.
