**Hit Film Recalls  
Nazi Landings Here**

"They Came to Blow Up America," 20th Century-Fox's thrilling story of Nazi saboteurs, which is featured attraction today at the Capitol Theatre, will recall to many the sensational newspaper headlines that told of the landing of Nazi agents in America last summer.

The film, which stars George Sanders with a strong featured cast headed by Anna Sten, parallels the actual story of the landing of the saboteurs on the Long Island and Florida coasts, their subsequent arrest by government agents and their execution in the nation's capital.

Carefully worked over by director Edward Ludwig are many of the details in the picture. Some of the "problems" which caused headaches were just what did a Nazi naval officer look like? How do the Nazis run their "sabotage school" and is it possible for a student in this school to have time for a love affair? That these, and many other questions have been solved effectively is well established by the rave reviews given the film by press and public alike.

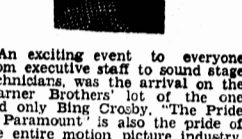

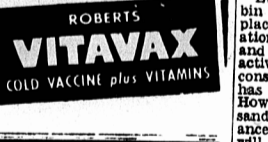
