PHYSICAL INCAPACITY NOT BAR TO HAPPY MARRIAGE

Especially Is This True If The Afflicted One Has Risen To Commendable Success In His Business Or Profession

Dear Miss Dix—When I was a senior in college I was stricken with infantile paralysis which left me with one leg 14 inches shorter than the other. I finished college and have a grand job in a large corporation etc. and manage to walk without a cane or crutches, although the stairs are pretty hard for me. Here is my problem: I am ready in love with a wonderful girl and wish to be married, but my parents are dead against it. They say that a cripple has no right to attach himself to any one because it would only be a hindrance to that person. I know that my girl friend doesn't feel that way about it, but before I take any steps I would like your opinion. If I marry in opposition to Mother and Dad, they will bar me from their house forever, and don't know what to do. I feel that a cripple has just as much place in the world as any one, don't you? THE COOK'S CORNER

CHICKEN PIE

Simmer the chicken in water to cover until tender. Add a carrot or two, a few stalks of celery and a small onion to the water in which you cook the chicken. When it is cooked enough that it will easily break apart, separate the chicken into neat pieces of serving size, and arrange them in deep baking dish. Cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture thickens. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Pour the sauce over the chicken in the baking dish. Cover with a biscuit top and bake in a fairly hot oven (400 deg. F) for about 30 minutes.
