ASSELIN IS NOW PRISONER IN QUEBEC

Civil Suit Has Been Followed by Charge of Criminal Libel and Prisoner is Greatly Perturbed in His Cell

QUEBEC, Oct. 22.—(Special).—Oliver Asselin, editor of the Nationaliste, accused of criminal libel, is a prisoner in Quebec jail and must remain there until tomorrow.

The Judge refused bail because Asselin had ignored the demand of the court to appear for a preliminary hearing. He looked greatly perturbed when he was led back to the cell today.

QUEBEC, Oct. 21.—"I have had a most successful trip, fully accomplishing my mission and am now awaiting orders," said Captain Bernier to the Standard, as he landed from the Arctic this afternoon.

Though busy with the endless details which had to be looked to after so long a voyage, Captain Bernier accorded a few minutes conversation to the Standard representative. "I have covered some 11,000 miles since I left in July, 1906," said the captain.
