OTTAWA, August 28.—The marine department has been advised that the schooner Theresa has arrived at Dalhousie (N. B.) with a case of smallpox on board.

QUEBEC HARBOR WORK. OTTAWA, August 28.—Six tenders have been received for Quebec harbor improvements. The estimate of improvement which includes cribbing and pile work, is \$800,000. W. J. Poupurt, of Montreal, and James Corry, of Ottawa, are the two lowest tenderers.

ERECTING STATIONS. OTTAWA, August 28.—F. X. Breton, clerk of works of public works department, left for Labrador today to superintend the construction of telegraph stations at Chabua Bay, Fox Bay and other points. Since the government line was opened operators at these points had to live under canvas.

CANADA'S ESCAPE. OTTAWA, August 28.—Considering the large number of vessels which reach British Columbia ports from the Orient every month, it is considered as little short of marvellous that Canada has escaped without any cases of bubonic plague. There were five cases with four deaths in San Francisco during the past three weeks.

EDITOR IMPRISONED. MANILA, August 25.—Fredk. Dorr, proprietor, and Edward O'Brien editor of Freedom, have each been sentenced to six months in Bilbilid prison and fined \$1,000 each for libelling Benito Legarda, a native member of the civil commission, by publishing a certain article in Freedom.
