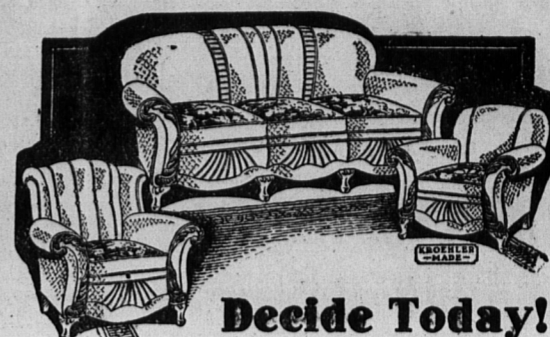

**Longer Voyage Smaller Costs**

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Oct. 4—When Captain J. T. Scougal of the freighter, Speybank, called at Cairns, one of the most northerly ports in Australia, for a cargo of sugar, instead of finding it ready in bags for shipment, he saw it waving in the June breeze still unharvested, to say nothing of being milled and bagged. Ready for all surprises the Speybank's master put out to anchor to save port expenses and waited for nature to take its course.

Cutting and milling operations were speeded up and the Speybank was able to clear the port in Queensland comparatively quickly. Sixty-two days sailing with only two short breaks for refuelling at Batavia, and St. Vincent (Cape Verde) brought the vessel on its 15,500-mile journey around the Cape of Good Hope to this port. As there was no liner schedule to live up to it was found more profitable to take the longer route via the Cape than to go through the Panama Canal where toll charges according to the weight of the vessel would have more than balanced the cost of fuel consumed.
