The Shop That Made Good in a Week

EGG LAYING CONTEST

Egg Laying Contest, for the 51st Week of the Contest, ending October 23rd, 1921.

A considerable decrease in weekly productions was reported for the 51st week of the Charlottetown Egg Laying Contest, practically all of the birds being in moult. The production for the week was 151 eggs, as against 231 for last week. The leading pen for the week was the Barred Rock pen No. 24 belonging to the Experimental Station, with 19 eggs. The Experimental Station pen No. 25 was 2nd, with 13 eggs; Mr. J. B. Millman's Barred Rocks were third, with 12 eggs; Mr. James J. Jenkins White Leghorns were 4th, with 10 eggs; while the Barred Rocks owned by Mr. J. E. Sinclair, the White Leghorns owned by Mr. C. McLellan, the White Wyandottes owned by Mr. J. D. McLellan, and the White Leghorns owned by the Experimental Station (No. 21) all tied for 5th place, with a production of 9 eggs.

Mr. J. B. Millman's pen of Barred Rocks still leads the contest by a good margin, with a total production of 1638 eggs. The pen of White Leghorns No. 21, owned by the Experimental Station is 2nd, with 1487 eggs; William Neale's pen of White Leghorns is 3rd, with 1462 eggs; Mr. James J. Jenkins' pen of White Leghorns is 4th, with 1453 eggs; and Mrs. J. J. McLellan's pen of White Wyandottes is 5th, with 1438 eggs.

Fifty-three hens have now given an annual production of 150 eggs or over. Mr. J. S. Millman's hen No. 3 Pen 2, holding first place, with a production to date of 259 eggs. Percy Mutch's hen No. 6 (White Leghorn) is 2nd, with 212 eggs; and C. McLellan's White Leghorn hen No. 1 in Pen 13 is 3rd, with 20005 eggs.

These are the only birds to date that have given a production of 200 eggs or over.
