CHINA'S DEFENCE.

In a long edict the Chinese Government has explained to its representatives abroad how the present troubles began and the attitude it now holds. This edict has recently been made public and we summarize it that our readers may know the nature of China's defence of her present position. The edict tells that there arose in the Provinces of Chihli and Shantung a kind of rebellious subjects, who have been in the habit of boxing and fencing in their native villages, clothing their doings with mysterious rites. The local authorities failed to check them in time. Within a month the infection spread everywhere. Then some of these lawless and treacherous persons sounded the cry of "Down with Christianity" and they began to create disturbances, burn churches and murder converts.

Then, the edict proceeds, the Chinese Government, as an extraordinary mark of courtesy, granted the request of the powers and permitted 500 foreign troops to be sent to Pekin, for the better protection of their legations. These troops did not confine themselves to their duty but attempted to dominate the city. This provoked the Chinese people and soldiers. Then the lawless Boxers became bolder, burning houses and killing foreigners. The powers tried to send more troops to Pekin, but the Boxers of Chihli and Shantung, now united, resisted and drove them back. The Chinese Government now became alarmed, fearing they might not be able to protect the foreign Ministers in Pekin. It was therefore decided that they and the missionaries should retire to Tien Tsin. While this was under consideration a riotous mob, wholly uncontrollable by the authorities, murdered the German Minister. Thereafter stricter measures were ordered for the protection of the legations.

At this stage occurred the sudden demand of the powers for the surrender of the Taku forts. The general in command could do nothing else but defend them. He and the garrison were overpowered and the forts captured. The edict proceeds to argue that while the Chinese Government was doing its best to quell a very troublesome and dangerous internal trouble the powers unwarrantably interfered and invaded Chinese territory and that this has enraged

the people greatly. While still endeavoring to protect the legations at Pekin it may become impossible to do so effectually. It is to be noted that the edict bears date June 29, and is apparently intended to prepare the way for a revelation of the awful tragedy which has since, no doubt, taken place in Pekin. The Imperial edict is of interest in other respects as giving the Chinese view of the situation and a connected story of the trouble from the beginning from the Chinese standpoint.
