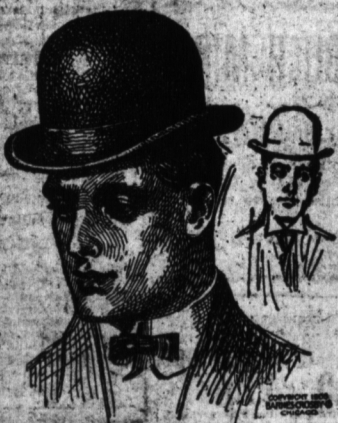

It is stated that the amount of the salary which is to be paid the new pastor of Zion Church in this City has been fixed at \$1400 per annum.

MARY C. CAMPBELL has resigned her position as matron of the New York State Hospital, and has returned to her home at Graham's Road, for a well-earned rest.

REV. GEORGE ARMOUR, a native of Alton, but who has been connected with the Waukaw Mission, of British Columbia, is to spend the winter in Winnipeg, completing his medical course.

Request for copies of the Prince Edward Island Prohibition Act have been received from London. These are to be consulted probably in connection with contemplated legislation which is to be introduced before the British House of Commons.

An information for first offence against the Prohibition Act, has been laid by Inspector Jenkins against Annie Mc Millan, West Wood Islands. The case will be heard before Stipendiary Magistrate in the Grand Jury rooms to-morrow at 11 o'clock in the forenoon.

The following resolution has been passed by the Charlottetown City Council: Resolved that this council authorize the issue of debentures to the amount of \$10,000 to replace ones redeemed and to pay for permanent work performed in 1906, said debentures payable in 20 years bearing interest at the rate of 4 per cent payable half yearly and to date from 30th September, 1906.

To get them to market in the best condition they must be shipped immediately after catching, in boxes holding about twenty five pounds.
