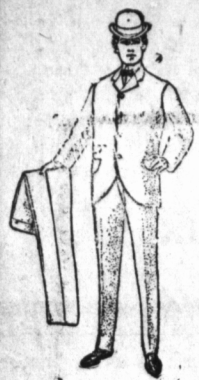

GRACE BROWN WAS MURDERED

HERKIMER, N. Y., Nov. 26.—Two reputable physicians who were present at the autopsy held on Grace Brown's body went on the stand at the Gillette murder trial today and testified that the girl received blows before entering the water that were sufficient to cause death, and which, in their opinion, did cause death in this case.

These physicians, Dr. A. O. Douglas and Dr. F. H. Douglas, both of Little Falls, but not relatives, declared under oath that Grace Brown was not drowned. It was their opinion that she died from blows which killed or rendered her unconscious before her body dropped into Big Moose lake. They declared that there was not enough water in the lungs of the body to warrant a theory of drowning.

SCARCITY OF COAL IN THE NORTHWEST

The Incredible Sufferings The Settlers Are Supposed To Put up With—Wood At Fabulous Prices. . . Large Houses With Only One Fire.

TORONTO, Ont., Nov. 27.—The Globe has been asked by Mr. Wm. L. Ramsay of Bladworth, Saskatchewan, to publish the following letter sent by him as Chairman of the Council there, to Sir Wilfrid Laurier:—
The hamlet of Bladworth is the supplying point for settlers in approximately twelve townships surrounding. These townships have approximately fifty settlers each settled therein. The country is open rolling prairie devoid of trees. The settler depends for fuel on wood and coal obtained at the nearest railway station, Bladworth. The local dealers secure their wood from the Prince Albert country and their coal from the Galt mines, Lethbridge. No coal has been obtained from

this latter source since April last. One car has been obtained from Banff September last, since which no coal has been received here. Ten cars are under order from Lethbridge, and none delivered. One car is ordered from Estevan and promised by the mine operator for December 17th inst.

Wood has been ordered from the Cowan Company, Prince Albert, and their saw-mills are cutting, and though we have inquired we are unable to purchase any cord-wood—there is none in the city.

Settlers here are burning lumber at \$30, willow bramble, twisted hay and grain. These sources are well-nigh exhausted.

Dr. J. Eyle reports from observation that no fuel is in the settlers' hands, and that suffering and perhaps death, will ensue therefrom. All the public schools are closed for want of fuel. The Saskatchewan Hotel, a thirty-roomed house has but one fire.

A blizzard has been blowing on the 16th and 17th, with zero weather. I leave you, sir, to imagine what the condition of your fellow-subject is in the electoral district of Batoche—a name not unknown to history. This condition is not local, but general.

We are informed that these persons operating the mines of the people are disputing over their rights—regardless of the rights of the people to live.

I would respectfully ask that you, sir, put an end to a dispute that is intolerable and the maintenance of which endangers the life and happiness (inalienable rights of all free people) of all settlers.

I ask you, sir, on behalf of suffering people, that by the powers vested in you the right of eminent domain be exercised. I can assure you, sir, without exaggeration, that this matter is one of life and death to the settlers here, one requiring immediate attention.

LADY CURZON'S WILL IS MADE PUBLIC

New York, Nov. 27.—A special to the New York Herald from Chicago says: Through the arrival of Lord Curzon in Chicago became known Thursday the details of the marriage settlement made in April, 1895, when he married Mrs. Mary Leiter in the Washington home of the late Levi Z. Leiter.
Lady Curzon received the income from \$1,750,000, invested in real estate and in bonds, and it was stipulated that if on her death she was survived by her husband, Lord Curzon should receive one-third of that amount, the remainder to be divided among the children, whose Mary Irene, ten years old; Cynthia, seven, and Alexander, three years old.
A meeting was held Thursday in the Chicago Club, attended by Lord Curzon, Robert T. Lincoln and Joseph Leiter, to arrange the settlement of Lady Curzon's estate. After the settlement Lord Curzon will go to Washington and a short time later he will sail for England.
Lord Curzon will receive only the income from his third of the \$1,750,000, and upon his death his share will go to his children.
Mr. Leiter said the principal question considered in the conference was the investment of the fund mentioned in the marriage settlement. It is understood one half the amount will be invested in stocks and bonds and the other half in real estate, some of which will be in London.
