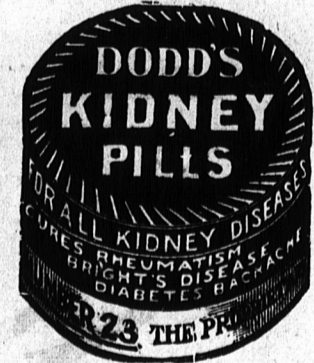

GRADUATING EXERCISES OF HOSPITAL NURSES

Zion Church was crowded last night upon the occasion of the graduating exercises in connection with the Prince Edward Island Hospital Training School for Nurses. Including the four graduates, there were a total of seventeen nurses in uniform on the platform.

His Honor Lieut.-Governor McDonald presided.

His Honor congratulated the young ladies upon their graduation and declared that he had no doubt but that they would meet with success in their chosen avocation. He pointed out that the profession of nursing is one lending itself to the assistance of our fellow-beings, and what such assistance means is exemplified to a marvellous degree in the great war of the present time. What the world would do without nurses in such times as these he was at a loss to say.

As the diplomas were presented to each of the graduates by His Honor, applause followed. A very pleasing feature at the same time was the presentation of a beautiful floral bouquet to each, the gift of Mr. James Tait.

Dr. Dewar gave an admirable address to the graduates in which he congratulated them most heartily on reaching the goal to which they had striven. "Graduates of the P. E. I. Hospital in the past have always been successful," said he, "and you will be no exception. During your two years of training you filled all the requirements for your calling and showed yourselves well qualified to nurse anybody."

The doctor spoke of the advantages under which the nurses of to-day train and told of the vast changes since the time of the world's pioneer nurse and heroine—Florence Nightingale. He urged upon the nurses the importance of developing such attributes as patience, tact, cheerfulness and resourcefulness.

"Take these attributes," said he, "and couple them with the training you have received and you will become skilled nurses, and in every avocation of life to-day skilled labor is at a premium and eagerly sought after by all who employ it. Vigilant attention in little things, thoroughness in all things, and honor in every transaction with those with whom you have to do, will bring you the success deserved."

Mr. Percy Pope on behalf of the trustees said that it gave him great pleasure to see the large audience present. Citizens are beginning to appreciate the importance of the P.
