

### AN ELECTRICAL DANCER

The modification of the well-known mechanical dancer shown in the illustration is based on the principle of the electric bell. While the amusing antics of the mechanical dancer are controlled by the hand, the manikin shown is actuated by the electromagnet. The mechanism is contained in a box. It consists of an electromagnet with a soft-iron armature carried by a spring. A wire from the battery



goes to the magnet. The other terminal of the magnet connects with the armature spring at L1. The spring is bent at a right angle at its other end, L2, and carries a platform, L3, strengthened by a smaller disk underneath. The dancer performs upon this platform.

A contact spring, S, is carried by the armature spring. A contact screw, C, is adjustable in its contact with the spring S. A wire runs from the contact screw to the binding post B, to which the other battery wire is connected. The current keeps the platform in constant vibration, causing the dancer to "dance." By means of the contact spring, the current may be varied, and the "dancing" will vary correspondingly. The figure is made of wood with very loose joints and is suspended so that the feet barely touch the platform.—From Popular Mechanics.

### LOST CROWN OF HUNGARY

Kossuth Was Thought to Have Taken Relic

The Hungarian crown, now bereft of its function, since its country owns the sway of Austria, has an extremely romantic history, and is regarded by the people as an object of mystery and veneration. Fifty kings have been crowned with it during a period of 800 years. In 1848 it disappeared entirely, and rumor had it that Kossuth, the Hungarian patriot, had sold the jewels to the Turks in order to get money to carry on his revolt against Austria, and had destroyed the framework. For five years a committee sought for clues as to its whereabouts, then a Hungarian, on condition of perfect safety, offered to reveal the place of the relic. Conducting the committee to Orsova, on the border of Hungary and Serbia, he there showed them the crown buried beneath the roots of a tree. Kossuth himself had hidden it there for safety while the rebellion was raging.


### NO MORE KILTS FOR CANADIAN BATTALION

OTTAWA, June 24—No more kilts for Canada. The Militia Department has decided that for the overseas force no more kilts will be issued and the units which have kilts now will have to wear "trousers" when their present clothing has been worn out. The decision of the Militia Council in this respect will have a far-reaching effect. Many indeed are the battalions in this country which have gone forth in kilts to fight for King and country. The 5th Royal Highlanders have raised many battalions, all kilts. There was one in the first contingent; then the 42nd and 73rd and later ones. The same is the case in Toronto where the 48th Highlanders have been recruiting battalions and the 31st of Hamilton, the Cameron Highlanders Winnipeg and the Seaforth Highlanders, down in Nova Scotia there are entire brigades of Highland Battalions. With the exception of the pipers, all the others will have to wear trousers. The chief reason is that the kilts are not suitable for the trenches.
