MORE CAPITAL WARRANTED

By Increasing Business, the Directors Decide, at Annual Meeting Held on March 5th

OF CROWN LIFE INSURANCE CO.

Charles Hughes, A. A. S., Was Elected Managing Director and Actuary at the Annual Meeting

Col. the Hon. D. Tisdale, P. C., K. C., M. P. In moving the adoption of the report of the Board of Directors at the annual meeting of the Crown Life Insurance Company yesterday afternoon, referred to the excellent character of the securities in which the company's funds are invested, as shown by the lists of bonds and stocks attached to the report. At no time since the commencement of the company have any of the funds been invested in any securities other than those authorized by the Insurance Act.

"In view of the disturbed condition of the life insurance business throughout the country during the past year, the report which has just been presented and which shows such substantial progress on the part of this company, is especially gratifying. Notwithstanding the recent criticisms and investigations of the principle and permanency of life insurance is universally acknowledged, and nothing has transpired which should restrain anyone from availing himself of the absolute protection afforded by sound and well managed life insurance companies.

"I notice by last week's papers the Dominion Government has appointed a Royal Commission to investigate life insurance companies doing business in Canada. I am sure we can and do with confidence invite its most careful investigation and scrutiny, and will do all in our power to facilitate its work.

"I will take this opportunity of referring to certain matters, which, although not connected with the business of last year, will be of considerable interest to the shareholders.

"Towards the close of 1905, Mr. Arthur J. Hughes, secretary and actuary of the company since its formation, received a very flattering offer from an insurance company in China, which resulted in his tendering his resignation to the directors of this company in January of this year. Your directors accepted Mr. Hughes' resignation with much regret, and promoted Mr. A. H. Selwyn Marks, who has been the company's accountant since it commenced business, to the position of secretary and treasurer.

"Shortly afterwards your directors elected Mr. Charles Hughes, brother of our former secretary, to the position of managing director and actuary. Mr. Charles Hughes is a native of London, England, and after some years' business training there, associated himself with one of the leading life insurance companies of Canada. Subsequently Mr. Hughes was for seven years in the Actuarial Department of one of the largest life insurance companies of the United States, and for the past four years has been Actuary and Chief Examiner of the Insurance Department of the State of Connecticut. Mr. Hughes is also an associate of the Actuarial Society of America.

"Mr. Hughes, therefore, assumes the management of this company with all the advantages of years of experience with leading life insurance companies in both Canada and the United States and with the special training his official position as a Government examiner in such companies has already afforded him. Under these circumstances I can cordially congratulate both the shareholders and policyholders of the company upon having secured the services of Mr. Hughes for the position of Managing Director and Actuary.

"There is another important matter to which I will, for the present, briefly refer. Your directors realizing that the limited amount of cash capital paid in has necessarily restricted the amount of business which the company could afford to write, have made arrangements for the further strengthening of the company by the introduction of a large amount of additional cash capital, which will at once place the company in a most favorable financial position and enable the management to materially increase the company's business with profit to all concerned."

MR. MOWAT ENDORSES.

Mr. H. M. Mowat, K. C. chairman of the Executive Committee, said it had always been the aim of the company to carry on its business with as small amount of paid up stock as was consistent with safety and insurance requirements, even although among the shareholders and directors there were found so many men of wealth and financial strength. The object of the directors had been from the first to make the company a success from a policyholders' standpoint, and that when the day came, as it must come, when the earnings of the company would allow it, the profits would go to paying bonuses rather than large dividends on large capital. The agents of the company, however, had been sending in so good a class of business and so many applications for endorsement insurance that such business would have to be refused had not more capital been paid in. It was gratifying that no hesitation had been shown to thus increasing the holdings of shareholders of the company.—Toronto Star, March 6th 1906.

THE PUEBLO TRAIN DISASTER

PUEBLO, Col., March 22.—Some two score lives were crushed out in a collision near Adobe, Col., on the Denver & Rio Grande Railway, and more than a score of the victims were incinerated beyond identification by a fire that destroyed the wrecked coaches.

Many others were injured, but all probably will recover. The wreck was due to undelivered orders, heavy mountain grades, a blinding snowstorm, a sharp curve and the slippery condition of the rails. Only the locomotives, baggage and day coaches were wrecked, the sleeping cars escaping almost unscathed.

Many of the dead were homeseekers bound for the North-West. The three crushed locomotives set fire to the splintered coaches and it was hours before all the bodies were recovered, the flames being so hot that rescuers could not approach the debris until the fuel was burned out.
