

Great Racing Seen In Saturday Night Meet; Mary Merk Wins Feature

Upsets and close finishes marked the night racing program at the Exhibition track Saturday night. A program that provided an estimated crowd of 2000 fans with the best racing of the season as the trotters and pacers battled it out from wire to wire in practically every dash on the card with the outcome being in doubt right to the last few strides.

Showing great pacing form Mary Merk, owned and driven by Earl Semple was a straight heat winner in the 2:24 Pace, feature event on the card, coming from far back in the third and final heat to beat out Dale B by a nose in what was the closest finish to be witnessed to far this season.

Other winners were Abegweit Milady, Lee's Nightmare, Johnny Kalmuck, and Bonnie Dale, with Johnny Kalmuck being a double winner as he led the field in both dashes of the Classified Pace. Abegweit Milady paced smoothly all the way and going away on the rail was never headed in the Classified Trot and Pace dash, opening event on the card. She made every post a winning one and had too much speed left as the remainder of the six horse field went to drives in the last quarter in a vain attempt to catch her.

Favorite Wins Feature

In the first heat of the featured event Dale B going away like a runner went right to the front and stayed there until headed by Billy McVeigh on the back stretch the second trip; Mary Merk, pre-race favorite in a trailing position until then staged a terrific drive that took her into the lead past the seven eighth pole and from there to the wire was never threatened as Billy McVeigh placed in the runner-up spot.

In the second heat Dale B again went to the front followed by Billy McVeigh and Mary Merk. They held their position right to the three quarters pole but Mark Merk again came with a rush, to half a length to the good at the wire after staging a stretch battle with Billy McVeigh.

The fans saw the most exciting heat of the evening in the final mile. Dale B again snapped the rail right after the word from Mark Merk. Mary making a bid for the lead as they hit the back stretch the first trip jumped it off to fall far back and seemingly out of contention. But driver Semple leveling his pacer off set out in hot pursuit of the leaders. Heading into the stretch the last time around Dale B was still in front and it was a spectacular sight as Mary Merk far on the outside came

like lightning through the stretch to just get her nose in front as they passed over the wire almost like a team. It was a great heat and a great performance by the Semple-owned mare.

Lee's Nightmare taking the rail from Miss Knox at the first turn was never headed in the number three event, the Classified Pace. In the last half of the mile Aubrey Budlong, far back opened up with a terrific burst of speed on the backstretch to get into second place as they thundered down the stretch but didn't have quite enough foot to catch the smooth-pacing leader.

Upset Victories

In the number four event, another Classified Pace dash Johnny Kalmuck provided an upset victory. In a trailing position to the three quarters the Walter Kelly owned horse paced around the field very fast to take over the lead at the seven-eighths marker and as they flashed under the wire was a length to the good over the runner-up Random Harvest.

In the second dash of this event Johnny proved his victory was no mere flash in the pan. Miss Comandante who went away in the lead kept to the front to the last quarter of the mile before Kalmuck's driver took him to the front and in the race down the home strip was too good for the field finishing a length to the good over Rosalie H. who also had come very fast in the last quarter of the mile.

Classified Trot

A field of six evenly matched trotters gave the fans plenty of thrills as they staged a great battle all during the mile before Bonnie Dale added another upset to the card by sneaking in in front of Brendon's Boy. Going away Buddy Budlong opened up a big gap but caught up to him to take the lead. As they hit the three quarters the field was pretty well bunched and as Brendon's Boy swung wide on the turn into the stretch driver Willard Kelly snatched the rail with Bonnie Dale and in the drive to the wire outrotted the former leader to take the heat and pay off handsomely on the pari-mutuel.

Two National Golf Titles At Stake Today

HAMILTON, Ont., July 11 (CP)—Ontario tees up two national golf titles tomorrow on the hazard-dotted par-70 Hamilton Ancaster course.

At stake, over 36 holes of medal play, are the Willington trophy interprovincial title and the Canadian junior championship, both won by Ontario players in 1947. Tomorrow's play is a curtain-raiser to the five-day match-play Canadian amateur championship which opens Tuesday, with more than 170 players shooting at the title won last year by Frank Stranahan of Toledo, O.

Ontario, with two new players on its four-man squad, rules a slight favorite in the interprovincial tests.

All nine provinces contest the two events — New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island joining forces for a combined entry in each.

Ontario won the Willington Trophy a year ago with a medal score of 14, well above the 583-stroke record it set in winning in 1938.

Only British Columbia is standing pat on its 1947 team for tomorrow's competition in which aggregate medal scores over the 36 holes decides the winner.

Cecil Dowling of Charlottetown, L.W. Beattie of Woodstock, N.B., and two Moncton players — Ralph Harley and Ben Isner — make up the N.B.-P.E.I. team. Harley and Dowling are veterans of Willington play but this is the first appearance for Beatty and Isner. Eddie Crowell of Halifax, 23-year-old Dalhousie University
