God's ways are mysterious. The truth of this was realized by the many friends of Miss Margaret Kelly of Charlotte when they learned of her recent sudden death. On May 16th she left her home to visit friends in Boston. She made the trip to her usual assurance and reached her destination cheerful and happy as having arrived. Leaving the evening train, her call came. Sudden and unexpected she was quickly summoned but she still passed peacefully and painlessly to eternity.

The many close friends in Boston and vicinity whom Miss Kelly hoped to see had at least the melancholy satisfaction of a final farewell and of viewing her remains as they rested for two days in a funeral home. Her friends, among the latter many former schoolmates with tangible expressions of sympathy and desire to pay their last respects, were impressed that the fairness of her countenance and her serene, strangely entranced in the tranquility of death.

To her home town of Montserrat the tragic news brought shock and sorrow. Her fellow citizens knew how she loved life and nature looked on his bright side. They greatly admired the courage and spirit with which she had in carry the met and accepted a severe handicap despite which she nobly carried on her life in home, community, and church activities. She was endowed with rare ability and good judgment. Her requirements in art and needlework merit commendation. She had a keen sense of humor and brightness of the home and social gatherings with her ready wit, laughter, and ready party she will long be missed and mourned by a legion of friends with whom she was a general and particularly favorite. A sister, Florence, sole survivor of the family, is sorely bereaved and to her goes the sympathy of all. A sister, Elizabeth, may soften and lessen the pang of grief and loss. May the many consoling factors that attended the death and burial of her dear departed, the many beautiful tributes, and the wealth of spiritual favors in Masses and prayers that are circumstances enumerated be a solace to the loneliness of a sister's heart.

The funeral took place on May 18th to St. Mary's Church, Montserrat, where the Pastor, Reverend Owen Higgins, conducted the service. Interment was in Vernon River Cemetery. Reverend Monsignor Maurice Macdonald performed the final rites after which she was prayerfully laid to rest beside other members of her family.
