Mr. James L. McKensie of Bay Fortune, was a visitor to our town on Monday.

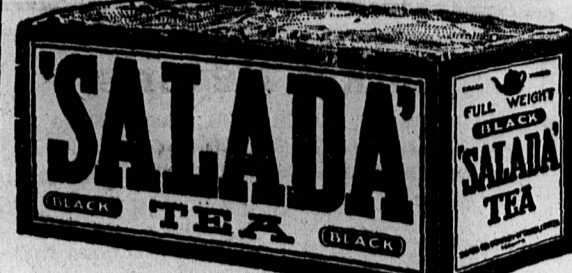

GARDEN CITY, Kan., June 23—(U.P.)—Wages to harvest hands in the wheat fields of western Kansas this summer will be the lowest in several years, according to the farmers. About \$2 a day and board is expected to be the usual scale.

The floating harvest hand problem became serious in this section about three weeks before the grain was ready to cut.

Each day has been bringing new transients looking for jobs, despite numerous warnings that there were

already plenty of laborers here to handle the crop.
