The Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, Feb. 4 — (CP) — Rye futures values on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange again advanced the full five-cent limit to day as new seasonal highs were posted.

CHICAGO, Feb. 4 — (AP) — May rye and oats moved in opposite directions most of the time in grain futures trading today despite general inflation and grain shortage talk.

MONTREAL, Feb. 4 — (CP) — A majority of securities gave a bullish display in trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. Volume of shares other than mines boomed to a nine-year high while in the indices banks and industrials were at new all-time peaks, papers at a new nine-year top and golds at a new five-year high.

TORONTO, Feb. 4 — (CP) — The Toronto Stock Market continued on the upward trend today and registered a new high for recent years. Western Oils posted a modest index gain. The closing period brought heavy turnover at rising prices in selected gold issues.

Some of the cheaper golds had a sharp run-up in the final hour. J. & J. advanced 18 cents to close at 134 on turnover of 78,000 shares. Colomac closed 25 cents up at 1.10.

NEW YORK, Feb. 4 — (AP) — Profit cashing on the lengthy swing to 16-year peaks stalled the Stock Market today and with scattered exceptions, leading issues backed down from fractions to around 4 points.

Extreme declines, led by motors, were witnessed around midday. Don Bridge developed a sharp decline and losses were reduced in the majority of cases at the close.

A. J. A. was trimmed on the idea that the market may have at least partially discounted a certain amount of inflation and business prosperity.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was off 3 of a point at 19.9, widest dip since Jan. 31.

Voting Qualifications:—
All Males and Females must be:—
(a) 21 years of age and upwards
(b) Resident of City for one year (except 4 below)
(c) British Subject
(d) Not in Arrears on December 31, 1945 for Civic Rates, Taxes or Assessments.

And must be:—
(1) Owner of freehold of land or premises for 3 months previous to the Election to the value of One Hundred Dollars.
(2) (Males) Tenant or occupant for 3 months at annual rental value of Fourteen Dollars.
(3) (Males) Have paid Poll Tax of Five Dollars for 1945 on or before December 31, 1945.
(4) Male or female, non-resident but otherwise qualified as above, if doing business and occupying business premises in the City; if qualification is freehold to vote only in Ward or Wards where freehold lies, otherwise only in Ward of business occupancy.

Multiple Voting:—
Persons voting on Sections (1) and (2) as above may vote in each Ward in which they are so qualified.
Persons voting on Section (2) may vote only in the Ward of which they are resident.
Property or rental qualifications sufficient in time but having preceded date of Election, entitles vote in former Ward only.
