U. K. Economic Crisis Causes U.S. Grave Concern

By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER WASHINGTON, July 3—(AP)—Britain's economic crisis is beginning to cause grave concern among top officials here. Government authorities who thought the economic storm would break later and be less severe now say privately that Britain and other Western European countries will have to take "strong measures" soon if the European Recovery Program is not to be endangered. British informants here said Britain has already told the United States that if its dollar supply continues to drop British purchases in the United States will have to be drastically cut back. In the top level of the Government, there appears to be an attitude that aided countries will have to act along these three lines soon: 1. Revise European currency relationships through the world stabilization fund. This, it is believed here, would lead to devaluation of the pound and some other European currencies. 2. Slash costs through better production methods. 3. Build up trade among the Marshall-Plan countries which would benefit the economies of all. Officials here said that a new trade agreement worked out in Paris Thursday night for the Marshall Plan countries was a small step "in the right direction." They added it was far from solving any basic problems.

Small Armed Services Vote

(By The Canadian Press) OTTAWA, July 3—Members of the armed forces who voted in the June 27 general federal election cast 60 per cent of their ballots in favor of the Liberal Party. Members of the permanent force or reserve army units in camp and veterans in military hospitals were given an opportunity to vote from June 20 to June 25 for the Progressive Conservatives 516, the C.C.F. 2,294, and the Social Credit 369. Other groups, including the Communist Labor Progressive Party and various Independents, polled 195 votes. The Labor Progressive Party's total soldier vote was 32. The returns indicated that only slightly more than 50 per cent of the armed service personnel entitled to vote made use of the ballot. It was estimated that about 40,000 qualified for the vote, but the ballot boxes contained only 22,714 votes. However, it is possible that some of those at summer training camp returned home in time to vote as civilians. A breakdown of the vote by Provinces follows: Province Total Lib. P. C. CCF.
