THE SENATE.

The Senate of Canada now contains 53 Conservatives and 28 Liberals. Some of the party papers are discussing the chances of the parties being equalised by the lapse of time and inevitable mortality. If the Senators were not such strong partisans, they say, the matter would not be one of much importance, but when an irresponsible body so frequently thwarts the will of the people as expressed by their elected representatives in the Commons there is some reason for making what seems to be rather a cold-blooded calculation. And so they go on to tell us that no statistician can predict with any degree of accuracy how long an individual man will live, but the life term of 100 or 1000 collectively can be figured out very closely.

All insurance men, these cold-blooded calculators say, are familiar with the tables of mortality and the expectation of life. If given his age they can tell you in a moment almost what would be the term of years which the average man of that age might reasonably expect to live. And so these tables are being applied to the Senate, and particularly to its 53 Conservative members. Most of them are of advanced years as are also a number of the Liberal Senators. It is taken for granted that all vacancies which will occur will be filled with Liberals so long as the party now in power retains the seals of office. The transfer of 13 seats from the Conservative to the Liberal side would shift the majority to the Liberal side, and it has been coldly figured out that this will take place within five years.

This may or may not occur. There is an old proverb which intimates that those who wait for dead men's shoes may go a long time barefoot. Besides, the Senators are mainly a vigorous stock, as THE GUARDIAN is pleased to learn, and have been able to far surpass the years laid down in the expectation tables. One of our Senators is now in his ninety-seventh year, the oldest legislator in the British Empire, and we hope that for years to come, at least till the century line is reached, he may enjoy that honor. The calm and serenity of the Red Chamber seem conducive to long life. So that it may happen that another federal election may come round four or five years hence and find a Conservative majority still occupying the red chairs in the Senate.

We conclude therefore that it would be better for the party to conciliate rather than to antagonise the majority of the Senate. Of course the effort would be quite wasted if applied to some of their

number. We have in our mind's eye a Senator who would oppose the Liberal Government if he had to be carried from a sick bed and supported on both sides by brother Senators as he stood up to record his vote. This has occurred. But there are others who might be amenable to gentle influences and "sunny ways." Bribe them! "not with pure shekels of the tested gold," not with offices or emoluments; but with gentle, courteous and affectionate reverence as befits their silver hairs, and above all with a policy so noble, with measures so fair, just and patriotic that will of necessity win their confidence and support. This is the true policy for the Liberal party with regard to the Senate. Don't make the old men mad by perpetually flinging the mortality tables at their heads, as a section of the Liberal press is now doing. Far better to win them over. And if we must "talk of worms and graves and epitaphs" let it not be forgotten that death may enter the Commons as well as the Senate and none can bar the doors against his coming.
