Col. Moore announced that Mr. Prowse is placing to the credit of Mr. H. Brown of his establishment half his usual salary during his absence. Also that three volunteers from Souris—two of whom were officers who resigned their commissions to serve in the ranks—were to receive an advance donation of \$23 each from the citizens of Souris. He handed over the money in gold to each amid great cheering.

The next toast was, Our Guests the Contingent, which was drunk amid loud and prolonged applause. It was coupled with the names of Major Weeks and Lieut. A. B. Mellish, both of whom responded very happily, eliciting repeated rounds of applause.

The toast of the Dominion of Canada was ably responded to by His Honor Lieutenant Governor McIntyre, Hon. Senator Ferguson, and Hon. F. de C. Brecken.
