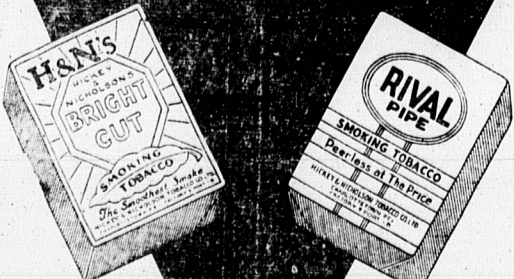

Morning Stock Letter

Received Over Pitfield & Co's Private Wire

NEW YORK, Oct. 27—There is no special news this morning which would have any unusual influence on the stock market. General Motors earnings published after the close last night were quite up to expectations. There are several important dividend meetings today including Borders Inland Steel, Norfolk and Western United Gas Improvement, U. S. Steel and Western Oil. U. S. Steel will also publish its earnings for the third quarter after the close. As usual when the market has a sharp reaction reasons for the reaction are sought for. The dominant feature today appeared to be uncertainties because of the election. If selling does not follow through this morning it will be encouraging and would suggest that stocks be bought and even if stocks are weak again this morning on small volume we would prefer to buy stocks on such weakness.

TORONTO, Oct. 27—San Antonio Gold Mines: Has made a new high grade strike at its property in the Rio Lake section of Manitoba which has been reflected in heavy accumulation of the company's on the local market by both Canadian and New York interests.

McKenzie Red Lake Gold Mines Ltd.: During the quarter ended Sept. 30 milled total of 13,296 tons ore from which was recovered bullion to the value of \$174,228. This compares with the second quarter production of \$202,789 from 12,830 tons and with the first quarter production of \$159,858 from the treatment of 12,576 tons. Label Ore: In a progress report that 40,000 tons has been blocked out in the old workings averaging \$10 per ton. This is sufficient ore to feed the mill for over one and a half years. The mill shows 95 per cent plus recovery. The diamond drill for new ore resulted in the discovery of new ore body on the incline below the fourth level.

MONTREAL, Oct. 27—(CP)—Prices for butter, cheese, eggs and potatoes ruled quietly firm on Montreal open produce markets today.

Butter was quoted at 24 1-4 to 1-2 cents per pound for carlots or less of No. 1, while lots to retailers were 25 for solids and 25 1-2 for prints.

Grated egg shipments in carlots or less were 46 cents a dozen for A-large, 44 for A-medium, 38 for A-pullets, 25 1-2 to 27 for B and 22 1-2 to 23 for C.

Cheese averaged 13 cents per pound for Ontarios and 12 1-2 to 5-8 for Quebecs, and N.B. Mts. 80's \$1.10 to \$1.15; Que. No. 2 80's \$1.00 to \$1; P.E.I. Mts. 90's \$1.30.

CHICAGO, Oct. 27—(AP)—Late upturns of Winnipeg wheat prices helped the Chicago market to score moderate gains today toward the last.

Clashes reported between Russia and Manchoukoo forces served as a late stimulus to wheat buying. There was also some notice taken of frost in Western Australia.

Wheat closed firm, up 14 to 5-8, Dec. 115 7-8 to 116, May 114 1-4 to 3-8, corn unchanged to 5-8 higher, Dec. 95 1-4 to 3-8; May 90 1-4 to 3-8; oats 1-8 to 1-4 up, and provisions varying from 2 cents decline to an equal gain.
