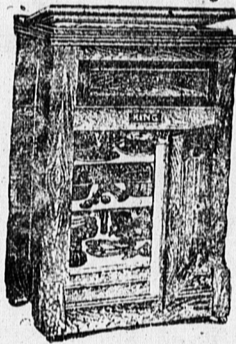

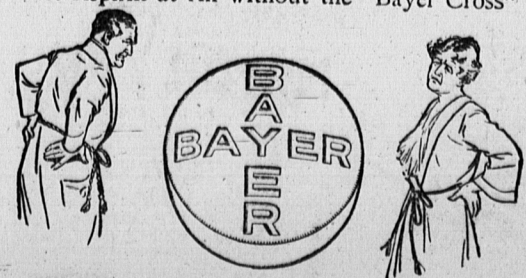

FERTILIZERS FOR GARDENS

The amount of fertilizers to add to various garden areas is recom- mended as follows:—
For a plot measuring
12' x 15' use.....15 lbs. fertilizer.
18' x 20' use.....30 lbs. fertilizer.
20' x 30' use.....50 lbs. fertilizer.
25' x 40' use.....75 lbs. fertilizer.
For average gardens it is well to use fertilizers carrying 3 to 6 per cent. ammonia, 8 to 12 per cent. phosphoric acid and 1 to 4 per cent potash.
