Scout News and Notices

Boy Scouts in the Barbados have met and sent two special winter emergency first aid units.

Twelve members of the famous London Boy Scout Revue, "The Gang Show" have been entertaining the front line troops in France. They have been declared one of the big hits.

At the request of the City Relief Department, the Boy Scouts of Victoria, B. C., on November 18 inaugurated a sustained six weeks drive for cast-off clothing covering the entire area of Greater Victoria.

A small New Brunswick boy's letter to Santa Claus placed in a small leather pouch and tied by a shoe string to a Christmas tree that was included in an American shipment reached a Scoutmaster in central Pennsylvania. Read the letter: "I thought when you would be putting presents on this tree you would find my letter and write to me." The Scoutmaster promptly arranged this matter with Santa.

The following delayed Christmas message from Lord Baden-Powell in semi-retirement at Nyeria, Kenya has just reached Canadian Boy Scouts and Scouters: "Hitler does not seem likely to give us a Merry Christmas so if we are to have one at all we must make it ourselves. One way to this end is to double our Good Turns usual at this season. Never was there so opportunity to give them as now. Our fellow countrymen are suffering anxiety or sorrow, under the additional hardships of winter. If we seize this opportunity to give them a hand our Christmas will be a happier one for us as well as them. So Christmas with all heartiness I wish you all a happy Christmas through happying others. "To those of our Brotherhood who have gone on service in the cause of freedom and justice I wish success, a happy issue out of all their afflictions and safe return. "Also I hope that the New Year may bring with it a wider goodwill and the restoration of God's peace in the world." "Baden-Powell"

"Rovering to Success." Lord Baden-Powell's handbook for the senior branch of the boy Scouts, has been translated by Brazilian Scout Leaders for use in that country.

In common with Boy Scouts throughout the Empire, the Scouts of Zanibar are giving municipal authorities all possible special wartime service. Many Scouts and Scouters have been organized as ambulance unit. Others are members of a local organization whose special duty is to prevent looting in event of an attack upon the town.

Older Boy Scouts of Salford, Lancashire, are giving valuable safety siren crossing service during blackouts, under direction of the Salford Chief Constable. Each evening from 6.30 to 8.30 in pairs, armed with red hurricane lamps, they convey pedestrians across "Belisha Beacon" corners. Approaching motorists recognize the converging or diverging lights.

Although Scouting is banned and suppressed in Soviet Russia, there are 1,121 members in the Russian Boy Scouts (National Association), one of the most unique Scout associations registered at the Boy Scouts International Bureau. The boys and leaders are emigres living in other countries. Scattered over the world by the Russian revolution, these refugee Scouts started Scouting again. They here and there established headquarters and training camps, and gave instruction in Russian history and religion. They have rendered many a good turn to their compatriots and to their host countries. In the case of young Russian Scouts constructed camps for people without homes. At Fabrega, France, they left their camp to join in fighting a forest fire. They remained staunchly loyal to the Scout Law and Promise, and to each other.

Claims Canada Needs To Tighten Belt In War

TORONTO, Jan. 17 (CP)—Canada will have to tighten her belt and live economically through the war years, regardless of any war profits that may come, John F. Lamb, president of the Bank of Toronto told shareholders at the bank's annual meeting today. "In order to avoid painful disillusionment over the next few years," said Mr. Lamb, "we must bear in mind that the war will be a tremendous test to all participants, and give instruction in furnishing some of the materials cannot bring us more than a partial compensation in the form of profit. We can look for a stimulated production in Canada, but we probably will have to finance it through our own resources and savings and that calls for a program of strictest economy. We may have to liquidate some of our external debt at the same time that we are providing the money for our own development."

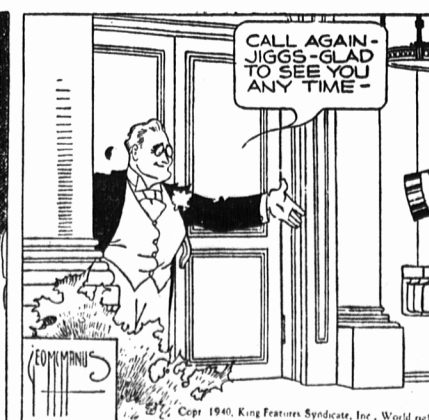
