ROOSEVELT IN LETTER TO LODGE PREDICTED RESULT. WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—President Roosevelt has been sure of the outcome of the election from the beginning of the campaign. In a letter to Senator Lodge of Massachusetts, dated Oct. 26, 1908, which was made public at the White House recently, the President said: "Dear Cabot: Prophecy is very bad until after the event. Nevertheless I must send you a line to say that I think the situation is steadily improving in Ohio. East of the Alleghenies I believe we shall have a larger popular plurality than four years ago; in other words, that Taft's plurality will be greater than mine, and I think that our electoral vote will be larger east of the Alleghenies than four years ago, because I think the chances slightly favor us in Maryland, although this represents a good deal of guess work."

The third match was a handicap for three prizes, which were won as follows: first, Geo. E. Auld; second, J. E. Matthews; third, E. R. Brow. In the afternoon there was a sweepstake match, which was won by L. H. Beer and a handicap match for three prizes which were won as follows: 1st L. H. Beer, 2nd W. K. Rogers and 3rd J. Landrigan. All matches were at the 200, 500 and 600 yard ranges. The best score of the day for the three ranges was made by E. R. Brow. WILKES, BARRE, Nov. 8.—After being mentally deranged for five years, nine-year-old Edith Williams, of Plymouth, is now being restored to sanity by an operation at the Mercy Hospital in this city.

A few days ago physicians who examined her decided that the derangement was caused by a portion of crushed bone pressing upon the brain, and it was removed.
