BOARD OF HEALTH MET LAST EVENING

ered by the Commissioners. The Company had their own waterworks system and the Commissioners did not feel like incurring the cost necessary to pump sewage from a private water supply. Mr. Wiley however did not seem willing to accept the city water supply and thus the matter stands.

Health Officer Dr. Johnson said in the matter of the health of the section it was necessary that the Factory be attached.

Coun. Wheeler did not see why the Commissioners should force the Company to take city water if they did not wish to. They had a right to sewerage connection. Coun. Moore thought the law compelled the commissioners to attach the Factory with the system.

R. Corder Hassard said the question was a new one to him and he would not like to give an answer off hand. His impression was that the Commissioners should attach the factory especially when the city health was concerned.

Mr. McGregor had always thought that the sewerage was supplemental to the water system. It would be unfair to every citizen to tax them extra for pumping the sewage from The Dominion Packing Company which was altogether apart from the city water system. If Mr. Wiley would make any overtures they would be considered seriously.

Coun. Moore contended that something must be done for that section of the town.

The question was further discussed by Couns. Clark, Stewart, Commissioner Dous, and others.

Dr. Johnson reported that a similar state of affairs but not so disagreeable prevailed at the Condensed Milk Factory. Mr. McGregor said it was a similar case to the D. P. Co.

After further discussion the following motion moved by Coun. Wheeler and seconded by Coun. Moore, carried unanimously:

Resolved that in the opinion of this Board of Health the Water Commissioners should take immediate steps to have the premises of the D. P. Co. and the Condensed Milk Factory connected with the sewerage system.

The Board then adjourned.
