TOKIO, Nov. 21. — Stocks on the Tokio exchange have recovered to almost their original figures and bonds are advancing. The announcement that the loan negotiated in Paris and London for the ten million dollars had been oversubscribed five times, and has been received with much satisfaction and has been accepted as an indication that Europe is satisfied that China is safe.
