Trading Speeds Up On Montreal Stock Exchange

MONTREAL, July 8 (CP)—Pluses outnumbered minuses two to one in livelier trading on the stock exchange and curb market today. Selected issues among industrials and papers in particular were stronger while a large number of the more active stocks traded today closed unchanged.

The Montreal exchange's closing averages listed papers up 1.73 to 345.53, industrials off 3 to 123.4, utilities up 1 to 77.2, banks up .07 to 27.16 and golds off .08 to 73.74. The industrial volume was stronger, reaching 52,400 shares, while 105,000 mining shares changed hands.

Abitibi Common, strongly traded led the upping in papers, ahead 5-8 at 18 3-8 and up 1-2 each were Great Lakes and M. and O. at 19 1-4 and 18 1-2 respectively. Abitibi Common also added 1-8 at 21 3-8 and B. C. Forest and St. Lawrence Corp "A" Pfd each added 1-8 at 3 5-8 and 42 respectively. Active but unchanged at the close were Dominion at 18 1-2, Price at 63 1-2, Howard Smith at 23, International at 51, Brown at 4 3-4 and Consolidated at 18.

In the industrial section Nucor was busy, adding a point at 14 1-4. Alzoma closed at a new high of 37 1-2, up 3-4, and 6175 shares of Standard Chemical closed at 8 5-8, up 3-4. Other gainers were Electrovue, up 7-8 at 19 1-8, Oranex Crush up 1-2 at 18 1-2, Imperial Tobacco up 1-8 at 13 1-4, Rand up 1-8 at 7, Fleet up 1-8 at 2 5-8, and Southmount up 2 cents at 43. C and D Sugar closed unchanged at 22, Canada Cement at 18 1-2, Massey Harris at 18, Canadian West Lumber at 2 7-8 and Consolidated Litho. at 1 1-2.

In beverages Canadian Breweries was ahead 5-8 at 26 7-8 and Seagrams added 1-8 at 18 1-4. Sicks Breweries was unchanged at 63 1-2 cent as follows up in utilities and C.P.R. 3-8 at 13 7-8 carriers.

Oil advanced with International Petroleum 1-8 at 13 1-8 and Home 5 cents at 4.65. Homestead was off 3 1-2 cent at 30. Okalta 7 cents at 2.08 and Imperial 1-8 at 15 1-4. Omnitran closed unchanged.

Up 1 cent in mines war Formaque, but Consolidated Central Cadillac lost 3 cents at 32. Nechi, Pitt and Sherritt-Gordon closed unchanged.

Stocks Push Up On N. Y. Exchange
(By Victor Kuback)

NEW YORK, July 8 (AP)—Stocks pushed upward today for the ninth successive session a record since the boom of 1929, following signing of the Coal Wage Act. Late selling on the lengthy swing however, reduced most extreme gains running to 2 or more points and put a number of market pivots in the minus column.

Early irregularity was succeeded by a fast spring around midday when news of the mining peace arrived. Steels, rails, motors and numerous industrial specials swung ahead with assorted favorites at peaks for the year. Dealings then tapered as quotations began to slip in the concluding hour. Closing plus marks through, were well in the majority. Transfer of 1,300,000 shares compared with 1,050,000 Monday and were the best since May 19.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 3 of a point at 66.6, highest level since last March and a gain for nine sessions of 3.2 points.

Canadian issues were irregularly light today. Canadian Pacific up 3-8 at noon, eased to close up 1-4. McIntyre held an early gain and closed up 1-2. Distillers Seagrams eased 1-8 and Dome Mines dropped 1-4. On the curb, Lake Shore and Giant Yellow Knife eased the minimum fraction.

Peaks for 1947 were recorded for Chrysler, which eventually backed down and emerged off 1-8 at 113 3-4 as stockholders approved the proposed splitup Superior Oil up 2 at 126. A.O. Smith at 58 (on limited sales), Acme Steel 1-3-4 at 49 3-4, Allied Chemical 1-2 at 186, Du Pont at 196 1-2, Westinghouse 1-8 at 28, Texas Pacific Land Trust 1-2 at 28 and Sears Roebuck 1-4 at 40 1-8.

American Telephone yielded 1-2 at 158 5-8, American Can 1 at 92, Eastman Kodak 1 at 44 3-4, Caterpillar Tractor 1 at 61, Lesser declines were shown for U. S. Rubber, Public Service of N. J., Douglas Aircraft, J. C. Penney, Standard Oil (INJ), Phillips Petroleum, Northern Pacific and Schenley.
