-LOT IS LEVELLED - A bulldozer, owned by Morrison and MacRae Ltd., has been working along with a crew of ten employees this week on the former Legion property on Central Street, which is now owned by the Town of Summerside. The building had been purchased this summer by Mr. R. B. Rankin and dismantled. Now the bulldozer is levelling the lot and filling up the cellar and now it is not apparent that a house ever stood there. A large number of the tall trees which were dead have been cut down and all the bushes torn out. Some of the trees will likely be left standing. The property was formerly owned by the late Mr. Justice A. C. Saunders and after his death it was purchased by the Canadian Legion. During the war a war service canteen was operated in the building and after the end of hostilities the Legion put the property up for sale and it was purchased by the Town. It has not been decided to put it to any definite use but it is a centrally located property available for any important use that might turn up. It would be an ideal location for a new hotel or a club building. The meantime it will likely be used as a public park.-S.

-THREE HAVE Close Call In Truck - Three West Prince men narrowly escaped serious injury and possible death when the truck in which they were driving went out of control and plunged through the railing of the Montrose bridge into the water. The men were: John Clark, Alberton, who was driving; Walter Wells, Brooklyn and Roy Gallant of Wellington, who is recovering at a hospital in Alberton. The men were coming from Nail Pond with a load of shore gravel when in some manner, Mr. Clark lost control of the vehicle which struck a telephone pole and smashed through the railing on the west side of Montrose bridge into the water. The door of the cab was thrown open before the truck struck the water and the driver (Clark) was thrown clear.
