DISTINGUISHED VISITOR.—Mr. W. M. Brittain, General Manager of the Export and Import Board of Trade, Baltimore, is at present visiting the Island. Mr. Brittain has the unique distinction of being the son of a Canadian born father, the husband of a Canadian, and the father of a Canadian, though he himself is a Scotsman and an American citizen. Mr. Brittain represented the United States at the Supreme Economic Council of the Peace Commission in Paris, where he met two old Glasgow school fellows in the persons of the Right Honorable A. Bonar Law, and the Right Honorable Arthur Henderson. The three were educated at the same Presbyterian school and attended the same Sunday School. Mr. Brittain's home is in New York, but at present he is located in Baltimore where he is engaged lecturing on "Economics" at the John Hopkins University. He is an authority on Scottish Folk Lore and everything pertaining to the Highland Clans, especially the MacDonalds, and has travelled all over Scotland, Nova Scotia, Cape Breton, and Prince Edward Island making notes and collecting information. On the present occasion he is accompanied by his daughter, Miss Agnes M. Brittain, who served overseas and entered Germany with the victorious armies. Mr. Brittain is a graduate of Columbia University and took the juris doctor degree in law at New York University where he became special lecturer in Economics, and last year was presented with a finely engraved gold watch by the students in recognition of his valuable services, in discoursing on that intricate subject.

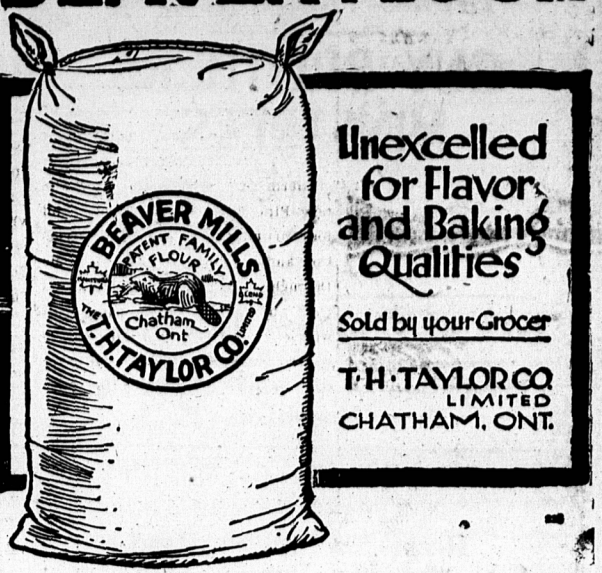

Scalloped Potatoes with Ham.
Six cups diced cold potato, 2 cups diced ham, 4 cups hot milk, 1 1/2 cup flour, 1-3 cup ham fat, 1-2 teaspoons salt, 1-4 teaspoon pepper, 2 tablespoons minced parsley.
Melt ham fat, add flour, stir till smooth, add hot milk and bring to boil stirring constantly, season with salt and pepper, add cold potatoes in 1/2-inch dice and cooked ham in dice or small pieces. Put potatoes or ham in baking-dish or casserole, add sauce and bake twenty minutes in a moderate oven. When serving sprinkle with parsley.

Green Tomato Preserves.
5 quarts green tomatoes 5 lemons 10 cups sugar
Wash and slice the tomatoes before measuring. Slice the lemons very thin. In a bowl place in layers. Let stand overnight. In the morning cook slowly until the tomato is tender and the mixture thickened. The time required will be about two hours. The recipe will fill ten half-pint jars.
