Game Between Abegweits and Saints.

SCORE STOOD 5 TO 0

The much talked of match between the Abegweit-Crescent and St. Dunstan's College football teams took place yesterday on the C. A. A. grounds. The field was in a deplorable condition and made it impossible to get in any very brilliant plays. About 400 spectators gathered to witness the game and judging by the enthusiasm displayed they enjoyed themselves immensely.

The "Abbies" were without the services of four of their regular players and their places had to be filled with substitutes. The game was an interesting one throughout and although somewhat rough, only one player was seriously injured.

During the first half the playing was fairly even, the Saints playing a good combination and the work of their forwards was particularly good. They were forced to rough twice in this half and the "Abbies" once. During the second half the "Abbies" played all around their opponents the ball never getting past the "Abbies" 25 yard line, while they carried it over the Saints goal line on several occasions, but no score was allowed. Five minutes before time was up the ball was passed to Bethune who made a splendid run and secured a try, afterwards converting it into a goal score 5 to 0. soon after this time was called with the ball in the Saint's territory.

S. D. C. although defeated deserve every credit for the game they put up. They have the material for an excellent team and with another year's experience will give the champions a hard fight for victory.

For S. D. C. Donahoe played a star game in the forwards. Kneway at

quarter, McPherson at half, and Blake at full back, also did excellent work. The other members of the team acquitted themselves very creditably.

For the "Abbies" McLeod and Bethune in halves showed up particularly well as they always do. McMillan at quarter played his usual fast and snappy game.

In the forwards the work of McKinnon, Jones, Darke and the McQuillans was very brilliant.

Almost at the start of the game McKinnon received a frightful gash under the eye, but pluckily played the game out. He was frequently on the ball and came within an ace of scoring on several occasions. Jones also made some brilliant runs.
