"Great Waltz" Best Musical
In Months At Prince Edward

"The Great Waltz," glamorous musical drama based on the life of Johann Strauss, recreates the romance of old Vienna at the Prince Edward Theatre, where it is playing today and tomorrow only with Luise Rainer, Fernand Gravet and Miliza Korjus, new opera star discovery, heading an elaborate cast. The story deals with the life and loves of Strauss, played by Gravet, Rainer, and the opera singer with whom he was infatuated, enacted by Mme. Korjus, who sings "Tales of the Vienna Woods," and other haunting Strauss songs in spectacular presentations. The Imperial Opera, the palace of Emperor Franz Josef, Vienna during the Metemorphosis revolution, the Vienna Woods, are elaborate details in the picture. A 90-piece symphony orchestra accompanies the beautiful Viennese singer in opera and other musical sequences. Julien Duvivier, noted French director, directed the picture with his brilliant Continental technique and human touches. Miss Rainer is tremendously appealing and rises to great dramatic heights in scenes with her rival for the composer's love. Miss Korjus is beautiful, has a flair for comedy and is glamorous personified as Carla Donner, the opera song bird. Players in an exceptionally fine supporting cast include Hugh Herbert, Lionel Atwill, Curt Bois, Leonid Kinsky, Al Sheen, Minna Gombell, George Houston, Bert Roach, Greta Meyer, Herman Bing, Alma Kruger, Henry Hull, Sig Ruman and Christian Rub.

Anesthesia To Make Fruit Sleep For Storage

ITHACA, N. Y., May 1.—(AP)—Apples and pears are put to sleep with an anesthetic at Cornell University.

The sleep is for storage. The new process promises fresh fruit the year round in some of the great commercial crops. It was described today by Dr. E. M. Snook, assistant professor of pathology.

The use of anesthesia to make fruit sleep while in cold storage, and so prolong its life and freshness, was discovered at Cambridge University, England.

McIntosh apples, which in cold storage keep only until about Feb. 1, stay fresh and firm until July 1. Bartlett pears, usually stored only six weeks, stay fresh for 17 months.

The anesthetic is carbon dioxide. But not a dime's worth has to be purchased.

If fruit is stored in a sealed place it will produce all the carbon dioxide needed within 10 days. Carbon dioxide is the gas naturally exhaled by all plants and fruits in their respiratory process which corresponds to breathing. Ordinarily the carbon dioxide escapes into the air, which contains only .45 of one per cent of this gas.

In a sealed room the gas accumulates. The result is to slow respiration of the fruit, and in effect to anesthetize it. After 10 days the accumulated carbon dioxide amounts to about 10 per cent of the air. More would smother the fruit so much as to cause deterioration. This is avoided by letting gas escape from time to time.

The cold storage temperatures necessary with carbon dioxide are 10 to 15 degrees higher than without. This effects a saving, which is offset by the expense of tight construction.
