Police Court.

At the Police Court, yesterday morning Peter C. Benoit, charged with a breach of Prohibition Act 1900 between the 5th and 12th June 1901 on complaint of John M. Campbell. Mr. Stewart, K. C., appeared for defendant.

Lemuel McLean of Brookfield testified to visiting Benoit's saloon and having beer. He had no other beer on that day and must swear that it was temperate. He got a glass of the same beer today. Perhaps it would affect a boy of 10 or 12.

Malcolm McLean testified to having some beer at Benoit's saloon. He asked for liquor but got none. He could drink a gallon without it affecting him.

There being no evidence to establish a violation of the Act the case was dismissed.

John Hughes charged with a breach of Prohibition Act between the 6th and 15th June on complaint of John A. Campbell, W. S. Stewart, K. C., appeared for Hughes. Hugh McLean testified to being in at Capt. Hughes' saloon and having a drink of beer. He could not tell what kind of beer it was. It was not like good ale. The beer did not affect him any more than water.

Angus Martin also had temperate beer different from the beer he purchased from Hughes on a previous occasion.

The case was adjourned until Monday next for further evidence.

John Sherry was charged with being drunk and disorderly on the 16th. On proof of service of summons a warrant was issued for his arrest.
