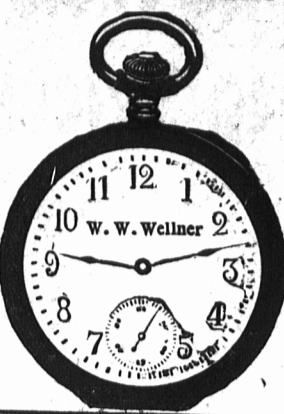

TEACHERS CONVENTION OPENED YESTERDAY

Good Attendance Especially from the Eastern Section— Interesting Papers by B. L. Cahill and Profitable Discussion Following The Program for today

The annual Teachers Convention was opened yesterday in the Y. M. C. A. hall. Inspector McCormack, President of the Association occupied the chair. Upwards of one hundred teachers enrolled. The President in his opening remarks referred to the educational changes that had taken place during the year. He welcomed the introduction of Co. solida ed Schools and trusted that ere long they would be very generally introduced, and regretted that as yet Midsummer holidays had not been made compulsory. B. L. Cahill discussed "Our Chief Duties" in an excellently written paper. Among the most pressing needs of our schools was improvement in the teaching

of composition and a more general teaching of Agriculture and its kindred subject Botany. Excellent suggestions were given for the teaching of these subjects and their importance clearly demonstrated. An animated discussion followed the reading of this paper partaken in by Rev. D. McNeill, J. McSwain, Inspector McIntyre and J. D. Seaman. The second session will meet this morning at 9:30 o'clock. At this session Dr. Fletcher, of the Experimental Farm, Ottawa, will address the teachers. A public meeting will be held this evening at which prominent public men will speak.

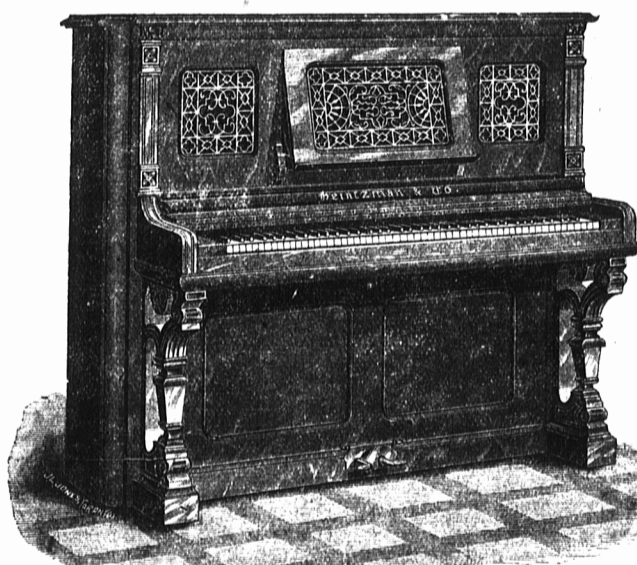
