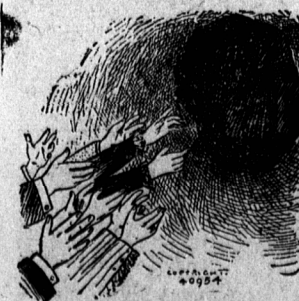

WIRELESS STATION AT PORT NELSON

(Canadian Press.)

OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 23.—The new wireless station at Port Nelson has at last been completed and installed and the first message from the terminus of the Hudson Bay Railway was received by the Department of Railways and Canals yesterday.

The message which was from D. W. McLachlan, Chief Engineer of the work was as follows:—"I am pleased to say in first wireless message that all are well, comfortable and busy at Port Nelson."

The establishment of wireless connection with Port Nelson will greatly facilitate the Government in pushing forward the work on the harbor and terminals at Port Nelson as the Department of Railways can keep in daily communication with Port Nelson and will be able to learn the exact requirements and needs. Plans seasons work.

Capt. Freakley, Marine Sup't of the work at Port Nelson has already arrived at Ottawa and is assisting the department engineers in making preparations.

(From Our Own Reporter.) OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—The Redistribution Committee held its first sitting this morning when Hon. Robert Rogers was elected chairman. Outside of briefly talking over the principles which should be followed in making the changes necessary, no business was done.

It was decided to ask for leave to sit while the house is in session as otherwise it would take a month or over for the Committee to complete its work.

It is expected that the Committee will start its real work on the western schedules first, taking up either Manitoba or British Columbia which are not expected to be very controversial. All members of the Committee were present this morning except Hon. Dr. Beland.

GOV. COBB WAS A TREASURE SHIP

HAVANA, Feb. 22.—The P. and O. steamship Governor Cobb was on Feb. 14th, a veritable treasure ship. Without taking into account what valuables the 24 other registered sacks of mail may have had one sack alone containing three millions of dollars consigned by the banking house of J. Pierpont Morgan and Company to the Trust Company of Cuba. The money was the first remittance to Cuba of the \$10,000,000 recently obtained through the New York bankers.

HERNANDEZ ON THE JOB J. Pierpont Morgan and Company had notified the Trust Company of Cuba by cable that the money was on the way to Cuba and it was expected Saturday night. Not taking any chances with handling such an amount, Colonel Charles Hernandez, Cuba's post-master general, was down on the docks taking a personal supervision over the remittance of mail. Cuban detectives accompanied the mail launch to the steamer and back again to the wharf. There Colonel Hernandez saw the 25 bags of registered mail loaded into one of the regular mail wagons and accompanied it to the postoffice.

PLEASE TAKE IT AWAY Colonel Hernandez did not care to take any chances on \$3,000,000 being kicked around loosely overnight in the Cuban postoffice department, not that he has fears, but he is not as trustful as he was before some one picked his private safe of \$1,000 recently, and he notified the Trust Company of Cuba that he would be glad if they would take that money into their possession just as quickly as possible after it arrived as he did not want to sit up with it.

MR. HORNSBY IN CHARGE Mr. Oswald A. Hornsby, vice president of the Trust Company of Cuba and formerly of Charlottetown, P. E. I. went to the postoffice in his automobile, accompanied by employees of his company, and was on hand to relieve Colonel Hernandez of the \$3,000,000 in question.

FIND THE RING There was no indication as to which one of the sacks the \$3,000,000 could be in, so the only thing to do was to begin at the first one and keep opening them until the right one was found.

THIRD TIME THE CHARM

One, and then two bags, were opened and no packages consigned to The Trust Company of Cuba were seen. Then the third one was opened. In it were found 31 packages of American bills, all consigned to The Trust Company of Cuba. Colonel Hernandez heaved a sigh of relief when Mr. Hornsby had issued the official receipt for the money and the postoffice was no longer responsible for it. The money was then loaded into Mr. Hornsby's automobile and guarded by the detectives and employees of the bank was taken to the Trust Company of Cuba, whose vaults were held open in anticipation of its arrival.

CUBA GETS IT

The Cuban government were delivered the money the following day. It was taken to the department of the treasury and formally handed over to Treasurer Figueredo.
