MARKETS

The Weekly Sun of Toronto, one of the best markets papers in Canada, gives particular attention to the Butter and Cheese situation this week.

There has been a cent increase in butter prices on important Quebec Boards and a half cent increase in Toronto. The tone of the market is strong.

Guins quote creamery prints at 28c per lb. and solids at 27½. At Cowansville, Quebec 14 factories offered 1-250 packages. 12 factories sold at 29½c and the balance at 29c, a rise of 1 cent in the week.

"During the past two weeks some pretty poor creamery is said to have been got rid of, and now the fresh grass product is coming in, it would not be surprising to see a healthier market and somewhat better prices, especially if the make continues to fall behind that of last year.

On the other hand, Montreal Dealers do not anticipate any great appreciation in values, as there is not the outside demand that formerly absorbed a considerable portion of the surplus product, though some small exports have been sent to the West."

In the Cheese trade there seems to be no slackening and prices have been chalked up one cent higher. Dealers have not yet begun to

store the new make. The storage demand should inject strength into the trade of next month and keep the market in its present stride if anything could.

Recent advices from England state that the make of cheese will be materially curtailed through the large shipments of milk sent to Hospitals.

Montreal exporters think that "the present high prices cannot last beyond the next three weeks or a month. Some think the change will come sooner but it is very apparent that there is a great scarcity of Canadian Cheese in England at the present time."

Guins quote new cheese at Toronto at 20c to 20½c and old cheese at 21c to 22½c.

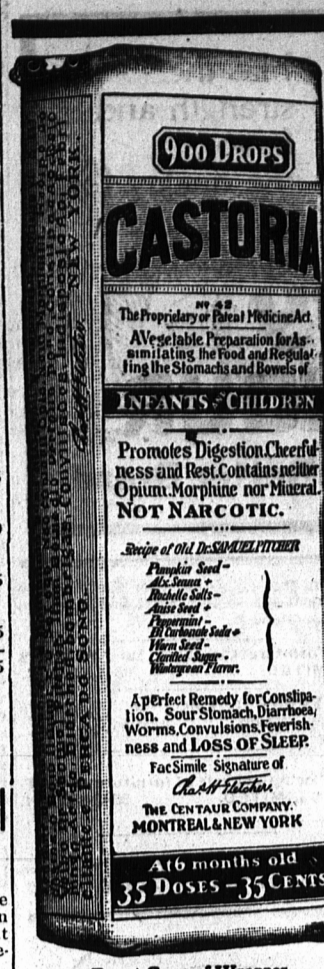
