Ottawa War Veterans Seize Accommodations

World Powers Seen Working Together By Russian Leader

MOSCOW, Sept. 24—(AP)—Prime Minister Stalin today declared he saw no real danger of a new war, and expressed the belief that Russia and the western democracies could live peacefully in the same world.

But at the same time the Russian leader asserted the speedy withdrawal of United States troops from China, was vitally necessary for the maintenance of peace, and "demilitarization and democratization of Germany present one of the most important guarantees for the establishment of a sound and long peace."

Nova Scotia Milk Prices May Move Upwards

HALIFAX, Sept. 24—(CP)—Retail milk prices in Nova Scotia will go up two cents a quart temporarily on Oct. 1 unless the Federal Government changes its decision to end its producer subsidy on that date.

The two-cent increase was the outcome of a public utilities board hearing today attended by producers, distributors and consumers.

Mr. J. A. Bernard, president of the Nova Scotia Milk Producers' Association, introduced his motion for a price of \$3.74 a hundredweight for their milk. That rate would have provided a three-cent-a-quart jump to the consumer.

Urge Farmers To Support Delivery Strike

BEAUSÉJOUR, Man., Sept. 24—(CP)—Approximately 260 Beauséjour district farmers who attended a meeting sponsored by the Labor-Progressive party here last night, were urged by Doris Neilson of Battleford, Sask., former Unity Party member of Parliament to support the Alberta and Saskatchewan farmers' delivery strike.

The Alberta Farmers' Union, with an estimated 20,000 farmer members began withholding produce from market Sept. 5 in effort to force the Federal Government to establish a fact-finding committee on parity prices.

Alexanders Arrive At Fredericton

FREDERICTON, Sept. 24—(By The Canadian Press)—The special train bearing Canada's Governor-General and Lady Alexandra arrived here tonight from Ottawa.

Official greetings will be given by the vice-regal party in the morning.

Tomorrow's busy program here includes visits to points of industrial and historic interest and the Stanley Fair, and a reception at the ball in the legislative assembly building tomorrow night.

Labor Congress Condemns Gov't Conduct

TORONTO, Sept. 24—(CP)—The Canadian Congress of Labor today endorsed a resolution supporting the Women's International Democratic Federation and called on the Congress women's auxiliaries to establish a women's congress for peace in Canada.

Pearl Werdow of Toronto, representing the International Fur and Leather Workers' Union which sponsored the resolution, said: "It is evident that reactionary forces are preparing for a Third World War."

Bilton Found Guilty Of Murder

WHEATBY, Ont., Sept. 24—An Ontario Supreme Court jury today convicted George Bilton, 26-year-old Ottawa weaver, of the murder of Mrs. Theresa Laurin, 34, a four-year-old daughter, on Sept. 18.

Justice Keller Mackay sentenced him to be hanged here Dec. 10.

Among them, he said, was Gen. Stalin's declaration that early withdrawal of American forces was necessary to maintain peace.

A note to the Soviet Foreign Ministry called Russia's attention to the Yalta pledge to assist the peoples of Europe to solve by democratic means their pressing political and economic problems.
